JEW BAITING IN POLAND

Wonderful Discrimination of Bullets Fired by Russian Soldiers at Rioters

Warsaw, June 14.—Twenty-four Jews were killed in the firing of the troops upon the mob which has been rioting in Brestlitvsk for the last forty-eight hours. Thirty-eight people, most of whom were Jews, were also wounded by the fire of the troops. Soldiers are now patrolling the streets, but there are mutterings on every side, and there is a serious probability that the trouble may be renewed at any moment.

The Christians began the disturbance, when a mob invaded the Jewish quarters and wrecked a whole street of shops. Many of the Jews used their revolvers in their efforts to protect their property, but those caught by the mob were ruthlessly beaten. The troops surrounded the district in an effort to protect the people and they fired three volleys upon the mob, but when a semblance of order was restored it was found that nearly all of the dead were Jews, as well as the wounded. The town is an important one in Russian Poland.

ASSASSINATED FROM AMBUSH

Murder of a Farmer of the Wilder Neighborhood, Near Plant City

Oscar Brannen, a reputable farmer of more than twenty-five years' residence in the Wilder neighborhood, three miles east of Plant City, near Cork, was shortly after dusk Monday evening murdered in cold blood by three assassins, who taking positions one on one side of the road and two on the other side of the road leading from Knight's Station to his home, discharged six loads of buckshot into his body as he was returning home, the shot perforating both sides of the trunk and the head as well as the breast, back and shoulders.

The murder was not discovered until the horse and wagon which Brannen had been using during the day in carrying watermelons to the station arrived at the gate of his home without the owner. A large force of men at once followed the road back to the scene of the tragedy, discovering where the three assassins had laid in wait for their victim.

The people of Plant City, en masse, immediately turned out and scoured the country in search of the murderers, the search up to noon Tuesday having proved unfruitful. Three white men, known to be bitter enemies of the deceased, are suspected as the assassins, one of the suspects having a short time ago drawn a gun on Brannen.

Three loads of buckshot discharged into the body caused death, after which three more loads from double-barreled shotguns were fired into his head, almost severing it from the body.—Tampa Herald.

THEY WILL BE CIVIL OFFICERS

Members of the Board of Control of Schools Under the Buckman Law

Tallahassee, Fla., June 14.—The members of the board of control, under the terms of the Buckman bill, will be civil officers of the state.

This is in accordance with a decision of the supreme court, which was rendered Monday afternoon in order to determine the exact standing of the board which is to be appointed by the governor.

Under Section 5 of Article 2 of the Constitution of the Supreme Court holds that the members of the board will be civil officers, and that no member of the legislature which has just adjourned will be eligible to appointment as a member of the board.

The court also holds that should a member resign now it would not cure the ineligibility of the member and he could not then become a member of the board.
