

SUEZ CANAL STOPPED

Blowing Up a Sunken Vessel Has Seriously Damaged the Great Waterway

Port Said, Egypt, Sept. 29.—It develops that the attempt made to blow up the British steamer Chatham, which sank in the Suez canal with its cargo of dynamite, proved to be somewhat unsuccessful.

A large part of the wreck was blown to pieces, but the canal was not entirely freed from the obstruction, and another charge will be placed under the ship and set off. A part of the hull of the vessel remains intact, below the water line, and this obstructs the traffic in the canal. It is believed now that the whole work of removing the wreck will take at least ten days and that vessels cannot pass through during that time.

Investigations which have been carried on since the explosion have developed the fact that the charge which was set off blew a hole 110 feet deep in the bed of the canal.

The burning and sinking of the dynamite loaded vessel in the canal has proven a very costly accident in every way, for besides the loss of the vessel and its cargo, the obstruction to the commerce of the canal and the damage to the bottom of the canal has been considerable.

WIND'S WILD WORK

Damage Done by the Recent Typhoon in the Philippines Was Greater Than at First Reported

Manila, Sept. 29.—Reports from places about the path of the recent typhoon in the island of Luzon and the southern islands indicate a great loss of life and property. In the waters surrounding Samar and other islands many coasting vessels and island transports have been wrecked.

The coast guard cutter Leyte is a complete wreck and eleven Americans and twenty-four natives were drowned. At the town of Passang fifteen natives were drowned. The loss on the hemp plantations is estimated at \$1,000,000. The army transport Juan Rodriguez is ashore at Legaspi. In the interior of the island of Samar thousands of natives are homeless, and the same report comes from many other smaller islands. Army posts in the southern islands have been destroyed.

The civil and military authorities are rushing aid to the suffering people in the form of supplies of food and shelter. Owing to the destruction of telegraph system reports are meager.

SOME POOR SHOOTING

Done by Connecticut Policemen in Trying to Capture a Brace of Burglars

Hartford, Conn., Sept. 29.—In an attempt to capture two burglars this morning Policemen Hayes was shot through the head and head of officer Crowley was grazed by a bullet from the pistol of one of the robbers. The burglars had dynamited the store of Howe & Son of Glastonbury, eight miles from Hartford, and robbed it. When the robbers reached the bridge and found the policemen there they abandoned their wagon and ran away. The police gave chase, and a running fight followed, in which both officers were shot by the men they were pursuing.

A large posse has been organized, and they are now hunting for the two men. The deserted wagon was captured and it was found to contain a full set of burglar tools and a considerable quantity of dynamite.

"I mean, sir, that if you mean to see your children," answered the prisoner, "you must be a teetotaler."


