TAYLOR WILL STAND TRIAL

Ex-Governor of Kentucky Will Return to that State and Face a Jury Next Year

Indianapolis, Nov. 19.—All doubt as to the future course of former Governor Taylor and former Secretary Finlay, of Kentucky, who have been exiled in Indiana since the murder of Governor Goebel, were dispelled yesterday when Taylor said he would certainly go back. He has not decided any more definitely than that it will be the first of the year.

Governor-Elect Wilson of Kentucky, was here for a few hours Sunday night. So far as is known, he and Taylor didn't have a consultation, but friends of Taylor saw Wilson. The latter said Taylor would have fair and impartial trial if he would return to Kentucky.

CONSTERNATION IN CHICAGO

University Because of an Order of Health—Reason Why Girls Won't Show Vaccination Marks

Chicago, Nov. 19.—There is wrath at the University of Chicago over the decree of the city health department that every person in residence at the school must be vaccinated or show proof of vaccination before the end of the week or be dismissed. The anger was confined to the young women, some of whom declared that they would rather have smallpox than submit to the order, which was issued in a final effort to check the spread of that malady in the big institution. The city physicians were sent to the office of Dr. C. P. Small, the university physician, to carry out the vaccination order. The young men readily submitted to the vaccination or showed the scare of recent treatment of that kind.

Many of the girls have the marks of vaccination on their lower limbs, and this is the cause of their opposition to the order.

Ebbert had been impaneled on the regular petit jury of the Lake Superior court, and had sat in one case. Ebbert buttonholed Judge V. S. Reiter in a corridor in the courthouse, and said:

"Judge, I'll give you \$5 if you'll let me off the jury."
