Chicago, Feb. 24.-Governor Hughes, of New York, addressed the Union League Club's meeting to commemorate Washington's birthday Saturday. He declared himself in favor of a governwhich preclude equal access to the high in official posts. markets for all industries and against capital in unfair competition. He declares fines upon corporations, particularly large corporations with menopolistic powers, to be unjust, because they are easily transferred upon the public or upon the stock holders.

RAILROADS WILL NOT REDUCE WAGES OF WORKMEN

Such is the Assurance Given by the New York Central and Other Great Lines

New York, Feb. 24.—As the result of a meeting here to consider reports that a general cut in wages is threatened among railroad employees, the members of the committee of nineteen, representing the various railway brotherhoods, are greatly encouraged. When they leave here, they expect to bear assurances to the members of the various unions that, on the great majority of railroads at least, no reductions are to be feared. In addition, declaration was made to the committee by President Newman, of the New York Central, that no reductions are contemplated by that system. It is intimated that assurances have been made to the committee by the heads of other Eastern roads that a similar policy will obtain.

Rome, Ga., Feb. 24.-R. A. Keith, an ex-convict, who served a sentence for murder, obtained a verdict of \$2,000 Saturday against the Durham Iron Co., for alleged mistreatment while working in the company's camp near Lafayette, Ga. Keith was leased to the defendant company by the state penitentiary and State Warden Goode testified that in addition to pay from the state he received a salary from the convict lessees. The verdict caused a sensation.
