**SUICIDE BY STARVATION**

Sad Fate of an Aged and Blinded  
Baptist Minister of Santa Monica  
California

Santa Monica, Cal., March 28.—  
Rev. Cephas M. Baird, a retired Lu-  
theran clergyman who had organized  
and built twenty-six churches since  
1854, fell asleep two months ago near  
an open fireplace. A live coal ignited  
a newspaper Mr. Baird had placed  
over his face and he was terribly  
scorched. His sight was destroyed,  
but physicians said he would recover.

After weeks of treatment, during  
which the patient's condition was im-  
proving steadily, Mr. Baird, with  
eyes tightly bandaged, asked the  
physicians if he would ever see again.  
As gently as possible the doctor told  
him it could hardly be expected. Then  
Mr. Baird refused food, and declared  
that he did not wish to live without  
sight or hearing. He died from ex-  
haustion and lack of nourishment. He  
was born June 28, 1835, near Akron,  
Ohio, and was well known in the East.

Philadelphia, March 28.—"Rather

arraigned before Magistrate O'Brien

picture hat, patted her daughter on  
the cheek as she addressed the mag-  
istrate. With the daughter she was  
arrested in a Market street depart-  
ment store yesterday by detectives  
who declared the woman purloined  
more than \$50 worth of caps, waists  
and other wearing apparel.

Magistrate O'Brien, realizing that  
the woman came from a good family,  
tried to aid them, but his solicitations  
went for naught, as the woman abso-  
lutely refused to take any steps that  
would lead to her release. They were  
held in \$500 bail for court.
