CROZIER'S WILD CHARGES

Said Bankers Association of America Has Sold Its Support of the Aldrich Bill

Washington, April 17.—Charging that the members of the Currency Commission of the American Bankers' Association, who came to Washington to oppose the Aldrich bill, had been brought by compromise to support it, Alfred C. Crozier, a financial student and writer, created a sensation before the house committee on banking and currency yesterday.

He mentioned no names, but said: "You listened yesterday to distinguished members of the commission tell the committee that they opposed the Aldrich bill and its substitute bill, the Vreeland measure. They declared that any emergency currency was wrong in principle and that, in practice, it would be dangerous. Incidentally, it cropped out that, with the tax on emergency currency at 6 per cent., there would be no profit in it for the banks; they fought it, however, on principle. On what basis? Just a simple little amendment, reducing the tax to 3 per cent. Why should this convert the distinguished fighters for principle and make them willing to brave the dangers of the panics they solemnly told you the passage of any emergency currency bill would cause? Profit—just simple profit."

He charges that the bankers waited until they supposed the public hearings had been concluded before they entered into the deal.

CLERK-CARRIER EXAMINATION

At Ocala, Florida, April 22, 1908

The examination will consist of subjects mentioned below:

Spelling, arithmetic, numbers, common and decimal fractions and United States money, penmanship, copying from plain copy (a simple test in copying accurately a few printed lines in the competitor's handwriting), United States geography, reading addresses.

Age limit, all positions 18 to 45 years. The age limits are waived, however, in the cases of persons honorably discharged from the military or naval service by reason of disability resulting from wounds or sickness incurred in the line of duty.

Male applicants for the postoffice service must be at least 5 feet 4 inches in height in bare feet, and 125 pounds in weight without overcoat and hat; otherwise their applications will be canceled. Female applicants are not required to be of any specific height or weight.

Applicants for the postoffice service are required to be physically sound and in good health. Married women will not be admitted to this examination. This prohibition, however, does not apply to divorced women or women who are separated from their husbands and support themselves. The examination is open to all citizens of the United States who comply with the requirements.

For application blank, instructions to applicants, and further information application should be made to the local secretary at the Ocala, Fla., postoffice or the undersigned.

No application will be accepted unless properly executed and filed with the undersigned prior to the hour of closing business on April 15, 1908.

ENRAGED AGAINST ENGLAND

Japanese are Finding Their European Ally Not All They Expected It to Be

Tokio, April 17.—Japan is becoming bitterly anti-British. Ugly charges of treachery against the mikado's occidental ally are heard everywhere except, indeed, from the highest government officials, who are too diplomatic to proclaim openly just how they feel. Hatred of the English is the keynote, however, of nearly every commercial or minor political gathering, of countinghouse chat and of talk on the streets. Threats of Japanese absorption of British Oriental commerce by both land and sea, the extension of the mikado's sphere of influence to India, Australia and even of an armed clash in China are heard from sources, some of which are exalted enough to hint at really serious developments. So far as political relations are concerned, there is no indication of friction.
