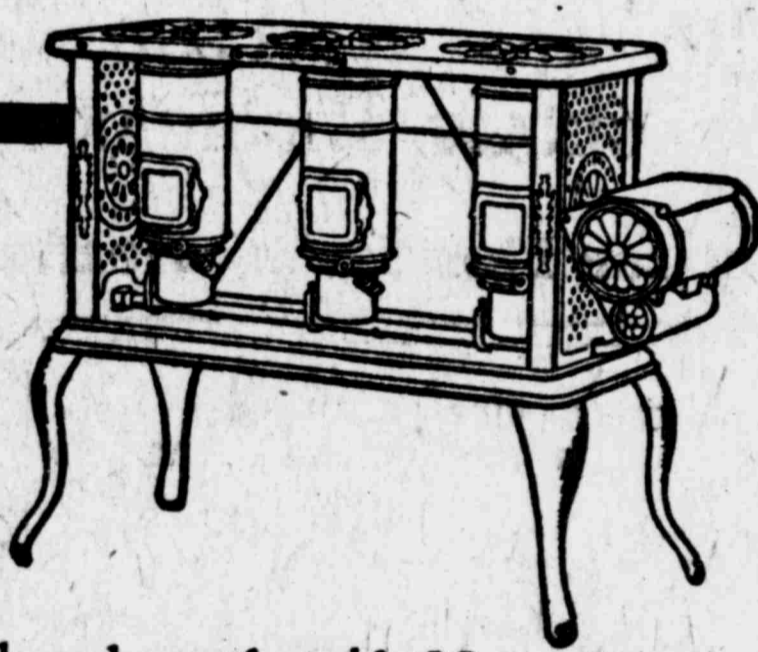

### COLORED K. OF P. REFUSED CHARTER IN GEORGIA

Atlanta, May 29.—According to a verdict rendered by a jury in Judge Pendleton's division of the Superior Court yesterday the efforts of members of the negro race to organize a Knights of Pythias lodge similar in name and having the same designs, insignia, etc., as those of the white organization of that name, is an infringement upon the latter and amounts to a deception and a fraud.

The verdict was rendered in the case of the Grand Lodge Knights of Pythias of Georgia against the negro organization known as the Knights of Pythias of North America, South America, Europe, Asia and Africa, the case growing out of the application of the latter organization for a charter several months ago. Immediately after the application was filed the plaintiff applied to Judge Pendleton for a temporary restraining order, which was denied. The Supreme Court sent the case back to the lower court upon the ground that a temporary order should have been granted pending the trial of the case before jury. The verdict was the culmination of the trial before a jury on the merits of the case.

The jury sustained every allegation made in the bill regarding infringement and the illegality of the attempt of the negroes to organize a lodge similar to the organization already existing.

Judge Pendleton's decree in accordance with the verdict will be given on June 10.
