the attacks made upon the adminis-
tration both in the Denver conven-
tion, which nominated Mr. Bryan, and
in the course of Mr. Bryan's cam-
paign.

Charge Too Serious

"Your charge is so serious that I
cannot allow it to go unnoticed. Gov.
Haskell has denied that he was ever
employed by the Standard Oil Com-
pany in any capacity or was ever con-
nected in any way whatever with it
or with the transaction upon which
your charge is based.

"Gov. Haskell demanded an investi-
gation at the time the charge was first
made, offering to appear and testify,
and he demands an investigation now.
I agree with you that if Gov. Haskell
is guilty as charged, he is unfit to be
connected with the Democratic Na-
tional Committee, and I am sure you
will agree with me that if he is in-
nocent he deserves to be exonerated
from so damning an accusation. As
the selection of Gov. Haskell as chair-
man of the Committee on Resolutions
at Denver and also as treasurer of the
Democratic National Committee had
my approval and endorsement, I feel
it my duty to demand an immediate
investigation of a charge against him
indorsed by the President of the United
States.

Asks for Proof

"Your high position as well as your
sense of justice would prevent your
giving sanction and circulation to such
a charge without proof, and I respect-
fully request, therefore, that you fur-
nish any proof which you have in your
possession, or if you have no proof I
request that you indicate a method by
which the truth may be ascertained.
Without consulting Mr. Haskell I will
agree that he will appear for investi-
gation before any tribunal, public or
private, which you may indicate, and
I will further agree that his connec-
tion with the National Committee and
with this campaign shall cease in the
event that the decision of such tribu-
nal connects him in any way with this
charge, or in case you, after an investi-
gation of the facts, say that you be-
lieve him guilty of the charges made.

"As the candidate of the Democratic
party I shall not permit any responsi-
ble member of the Republican organi-
zation to misrepresent the attitude of
the Democratic party in the present
campaign. I have assisted you to the
extent of my ability in remedial mat-
ters which I deemed for the public
good which you have undertaken; I
have urged Democrats to support such
measures, and I have advocated more
radical measures against private mon-
opolies than either you or your party
associates have been willing to under-
take.

"The platform of the Democratic
party is clear and specific on this sub-
ject as on other subjects, while the
platform of the Republican party is
uncertain and evasive.

Fixing Contribution Amounts

"The Democratic candidate for Vice
President, Mr. Kern, joined with me
in requesting the Democratic National
Committee to fix a maximum of \$10,-
000 for individual contributions and to
publish before the election all contribu-
tions above \$100 and the committee
acted favorably upon this request. The
Republican candidate and the Republi-
can National Committee proposed no
publication, before the election, but
publication after the election. I sub-
mit that our committee has given the
better evidence of its freedom from
connection with or obligation to the
predatory interests. Our committee
has not knowingly received a dollar
from an official of any corporation
known as a trust, and it will not re-
ceive any money from such. If any
money is contributed by such persons
without the knowledge of the commit-
tee it will be returned as soon as the
fact is discovered.

"The Democratic party is making an
honest and an honorable fight in de-
fense of the principles and policies
enunciated in its platform, and it ex-
pects and will demand fair and hon-
orable treatment from those who are
in charge of the Republican cam-
paign.

PINE OIL AND ITS USES

A striking example of a seemingly
useless waste product of the forest
which has developed into a marketable
commodity of no small importance is
what is known as pine oil. The crude
wood turpentine obtained from the
steam distillation of certain species of
pine must be refined with considerable
care before it can be sold in competi-
tion with gum spirits, the true turpen-
tine of commerce. By redistillation
with steam this crude product is usu-
ally separated into two substances.
The first, which is the larger fraction,
consists almost entirely of the product
known technically as "pineene." This
closely resembles gum turpentine ex-
cept for a barely perceptible difference
in odor. The other fraction is a prod-
uct somewhat thicker and heavier than
turpentine, with a yellow color and a
very pleasant odor. This is known as
"pine oil."

Formerly this by-product had no
market and was either burned or sold
for almost nothing in order to get rid
of it. It was realized, however, that
it was extremely poor business to
waste three or more gallons of oil for
every cord of wood without knowing
certainly whether the oil was of value,
and it was clearly up to the chemist
to find uses for pine oil, and to the
salesman to create a market.

Pine oil is now sold in tank car lots
to manufacturers of roofing paints and
varnishes. Considerable quantities are
consumed in the manufacture of in-
sulating materials, metal polishes, and
cheap perfume. It has been found to
yield very cheaply "turpentine hydrate,"
a drug which at present is manufac-
tured by somewhat costly methods

Pine oil has also been suggested as an
excellent solvent for varnish gums for
the production of light colored var-
nishes. Further investigation may even
lead to its use as a raw material in the
production of artificial camphor.

Thus, from a worthless product, pine
oil has so much increased in value that
refined grades may now be sold for
from 40 to 50 cents a gallon. The very
lowest grades sell for about 10 cents
a gallon.

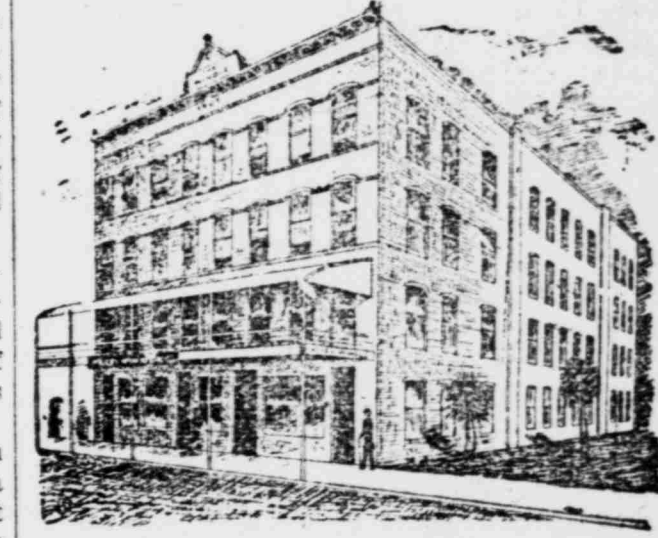
