Commercial Law. Brief Digest of Laws Compiled for the St. Louis Gazette. HEAD OF A FAMILY. A married woman, living with her child, and abandoned by her husband, is the head of a family within the meaning of the executive law.

CONTRACTS AGAINST PUBLIC POLICY. All contracts for services to be rendered, in influencing public officials to grant to particular persons control of business operations of the government, are void as against public policy.

CONFEDERATE MONEY. An executor of an estate in Tennessee received Confederate money, voluntarily, on account of a legatee living in the loyal State.
