The Higher Law and the Irrepressible Conflict.

The political enemies of William H. Seward ascribe to him the honor of originating two of the grandest ideas ever proclaimed by any American statesman. One is the idea of a Higher Law, and the other is the irrepressible conflict between the opposing and enduring forces of Freedom and Slavery.

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Trial and Conviction of Capt. Brown.

The trial of Capt. Brown, which commenced at Charlottesville, Va., on the 29th inst., was concluded on Monday last, and the jury, after a recess of half an hour, found a verdict of guilty of murder and treason.

The testimony of witnesses during the trial elicited few new facts. Brown instructed his counsel not to enter the plea of insanity, declaring that, if he was or ever had been insane, the fact was unknown to him.
