President Crisp's Scheme of Revenge  
Was Downed Hard.

President Crisp could see nothing but the sadness and disappointment of life Monday.

Two of his pet projects met with disaster. The repeal of the resolutions granting conduit rights to the Central Union Telephone company was a hard blow, but the one "that almost killed Crisp" was to come.

Inspector James Mahoney had the temerity to ask that he be appointed as one of the Republican members of the Board of City Commissioners. His candidacy was antagonistic to Crisp and the Sixth ward statesman made preparations to revenge himself for this affront to his "personal popularity." He could not reconcile himself to the sight of Mahoney drawing money from the city treasury, by reason of his position as inspector.

Monday morning the Chairman of the Street Committee (Crisp) recommended the appointment of George Wilson as inspector for the Maple st. pavement. He had flattered himself that this recommendation would meet with approval. When the vote was taken Crisp and McMillen voted "aye" and McGarry and Paige "no." The motion was lost and Crisp was dumfounded.
