MISSING.
Alleged Forged Note.
State Finds Itself Badly Handicapped.
Claimed Norris' Attorneys Have It.
Prosecutor Demands That It Be Produced.
Jury Secured Without Trouble—Trial Is New On.

The note, alleged to have been forged by Attorney W. A. Norris, is not in evidence.

In opening the case Monday morning Prosecutor Wanamaker admitted that he did not have possession of this important instrument, on which the whole case is based.

This means that the State is at a great disadvantage in its prosecution of the charges. As it now stands it must first establish the fact of the existence of the alleged note and then prove that it was executed by Norris.

The note which the state charges was forged by Norris was dated June 12, 1907. The names of L. P. Workman, Emma A. Workman and Hannah Messer are alleged to have been forged to it by Norris. The note, Emmons S. Oviatt claims, was sold to him. Its face value was \$300. When it was presented to the alleged maker, they refused payment, on the ground that their names were forged. Later, it is alleged Oviatt was paid the full amount by Norris, who again got possession of the note. Just where it is now is a question. The state claims it is in the hands of E. F. Voris, one of the attorneys for Norris. Prosecutor Wanamaker asks that Mr. Voris be ordered to produce it or have a photographic copy made of the same. The court has not passed on the question.

There was but little trouble experienced in getting a jury. Mr. Oviatt was the first witness called for the State.
