Be it resolved by the Council of the city of Akron, Ohio, and declaring the same to be necessary, the intention is hereby expressed that Falor street be extended from the east line of the towing path of the Ohio canal to Bowery street, according to the plan on file in the office of the City Civil Engineer.

A RESOLUTION For the improvement of Falor street, from Bowery street to a point 450 feet easterly therefrom.

Be it resolved by the council of the city of Akron, Ohio, two-thirds of all the members elected thereto concurring, that it is necessary and the intention is hereby declared to improve Falor street, from Bowery street to a point 450 feet easterly therefrom, by grading the same to the established grade, curbing with stone, guttering with brick, and by constructing the necessary culverts, drains, retaining walls and a bridge across the Ohio canal, all in accordance with the plans and profile on file in the office of the City Civil Engineer.

That the cost and expense of said improvement, except one-fifth and the cost of intersections, shall be assessed upon all the lots and lands and parcels thereof, in proportion to the benefits which may result from said improvement within the following boundaries, to-wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the center lines of High and Cedar streets; thence westerly along the center line of Cedar street to the center of Portage street; thence northerly along the center of Portage street to the center of Exchange street; thence north-westerly along the center of Exchange street to the center of Maple street; thence westerly along the center of Maple street to the west corporation line, thence southerly along the west corporation line to the center of Bartsge street; thence easterly along the center of Bartsge street to the center of Main street; thence northerly along the center of Main street to the center of Iron street; thence easterly along the center of Iron street to the center of High street; thence northerly along the center of High street to the place of beginning.

Said assessment shall be payable in six (6) equal annual installments, and bonds shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of the same provided that said assessment shall in no case exceed the limitations imposed by Section 2270 of the Revised Statutes of Ohio, and the council find and hereby declare that only the property hereinafter described shall be specially benefited by the improvement hereof, and that no other property than that specified shall be assessed for said improvement.

The clerk is hereby authorized to cause this resolution to be published, and Frank Bonstedt is hereby appointed to serve notice of the passage hereof upon all the owners of property bounding and abutting upon said Falor street, between the points aforesaid, as is hereby by law.

I hereby certify that the plans and profile for the above improvement are on file in the office of the City Civil Engineer.
