**AN ORDINANCE.**  
Adopting a plan of sewerage and drainage for a portion of the city of Akron, and designating such portion of the work as is required for immediate use.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the council of the city of Akron, Ohio, that the plan of sewerage and drainage prepared by the City Civil Engineer, and on file in his office, for that part of the city of Akron, Ohio, known as sewer district No. 9, as heretofore established, be and the same is hereby adopted.

Whereas, in the opinion of the council of the city of Akron, Ohio, the following system of sewerage and drainage lying within sewer district No. 9, and required for immediate use, and such system of sewerage and drainage is hereby designated as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the intersection of Exchange and Willow streets, thence easterly along Exchange street to a point opposite the south-west corner of lot No. 9, Nash allotment; thence northerly through lots numbers 9 and 37, Nash allotment, and lot number 10, Nelson allotment, to State street.

**AN ORDINANCE.**  
To amend sections 85 of the revised ordinances of the city of Akron, Ohio, prohibiting any owner or occupant of any dwelling, factory, store, shop, etc., from permitting the same to become or continue in a nuisance, offensive or unhealthful condition.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the council of the city of Akron, Ohio, that Section 85 of the Revised Ordinances of said city be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: No owner or occupant of any dwelling, store, shop, grocery, cellar, area, tallow-chandlers shop, tannery, brewery, distillery, pork or beef packing house, butcher shop, stall or meat market, livery stable, barn, pig pen, poultry yard, soap factory, ware house, place of keeping hides or skins, or premises or grounds of whatsoever kind or nature, shall suffer the same to become or to continue in such condition as to be noxious, offensive or injurious to the health of the citizens or any part thereof of the said city of Akron.

Section 2.—That said Section 85 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Akron, Ohio, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication according to law.

**BOND ORDINANCE.**  
An ordinance of the city of Akron authorizing the issue of bonds in anticipation of the collection of special assessments for the construction of a main trunk sewer in sewer district No. 5.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the City Council of the city of Akron, Ohio, that three-fourths of all the members elected thereto concurring, that the Mayor and Clerk of said city, in the manner provided by chapter 2 of division 9 of title 12 of part first of the Revised Statutes of Ohio, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to issue bonds of said city, for the purpose of providing a fund for the immediate payment of the cost and expense of constructing a main trunk sewer in sewer district No. 5, to the amount of \$900, and in denominations and payable at the times following, to-wit:

Three bonds of \$100, payable in one year from their date.

Three bonds of \$100, payable in two years from their date.

Three bonds of \$100, payable in three years from their date.

Section 2. That said bonds shall be dated September 1, 1900, shall express upon their face the (1) the name and number of said sewer district No. 5, and for which they are issued, together with the purpose of their issue; shall bear a rate of interest not exceeding five per cent per annum, payable semi-annually; shall be signed by the Mayor and the City Clerk and shall have affixed thereto the corporate seal of the city of Akron. They shall have interest coupons attached, duly signed by the City Clerk, and shall be payable, both principal and interest, at National Park bank, New York city, and shall be sold under the direction of the committee on finance of the City Council, at not less than their par value.

Section 3. That upon the sale of said bonds the proceeds thereof shall be placed in the city treasury, and the said assessments, and all portions thereof, when collected, shall be applied to the payment of said bonds, and the interest thereon as the same shall become due, and to no other purpose whatever.

Section 4. That the faith and credit of the city of Akron are hereby pledged for the payment of both principal and interest of said bonds at maturity.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall take effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**AN ORDINANCE.**  
Authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to borrow money to replenish the sanitary fund.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the council of the city of Akron, Ohio, that to replenish the sanitary fund, that the sum of six thousand (\$6000) dollars be borrowed.

Sec. 2. That the mayor and clerk of said city are hereby directed and authorized and empowered, for and on behalf of said city, to execute its promissory note for four months, interest not to exceed six per cent per annum, and said amount so borrowed shall be placed in the hands of the city treasurer to the credit of the sanitary fund.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**AN ORDINANCE.**  
To levy a tax for municipal purposes for the year 1900.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Council of the city of Akron, Ohio, that there shall and hereby is levied and assessed upon all the taxable, real and personal property within the limits of the city of Akron, Ohio, for municipal purposes for the year 1900, the following rates on each dollar of valuation of said real and personal property as returned for taxation upon the general duplicate of taxes of Summit county, Ohio, to-wit:

For the general purpose of corporation to supply the fund known as the general fund ..... 1.85 mills

For the purpose of street improvements and repairs, to supply the fund known as the street fund ..... 1.20 mills

For the purpose of supporting the fire department, to supply the fund known as the fire department fund ..... 2.90 mills

For the purpose of lighting the corporation, to supply the fund known as the light fund ..... 1.50 mills

For the purpose of paying the chief of police, prison-keeper, police force and the expense of the police department, to supply the fund known as the police fund ..... .80 mills

For the purpose of keeping and maintaining a public library and reading room, to supply the fund known as the library fund ..... .40 mills

For the purpose of extinguishing and paying the bonds and debts of the city, to supply the fund known as the sinking fund, under section 2712 of the Revised Statutes of Ohio, ..... .15 mills

For sanitary and street cleaning purposes, to supply the fund known as the sanitary fund, ..... .10 mills

For the purpose of providing grounds and public parks, and for the improvement and keeping in repairs the parks of the city, to supply the fund known as the park fund ..... .15 mills

For the care of the poor of the city of Akron, Ohio, to supply the fund known as the poor fund ..... .25 mills

Section 2. That there shall be and hereby is levied and assessed upon all the taxable, real and personal property within the limits of sewer districts of said city hereinafter mentioned, for the purpose of providing a fund to pay the principal and interest on bonds issued by authority of the

General Statutes of the State of Ohio, and an act of the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, passed April 17, 1885, for the payment of the excess of the cost of constructing main sewers in said districts over and above the amount assessed upon the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon the streets, lanes and alleys, etc., in and along which said sewers are constructed, the following rates on each dollar of valuation of said real and personal property as returned and assessed for taxation, upon the general duplicate of taxes of Summit county, Ohio, to-wit:

In sewer district No. 3, ..... 3 mills  
In sewer district No. 4, ..... 3 mills  
In sewer district No. 5, ..... 3 mills  
In sewer district No. 6, ..... 3/4 mill

In sewer district No. 9, ..... 2 mills  
In sewer district No. 10, ..... 3 mills

Section 3. That there shall be and hereby is levied and assessed upon all the taxable, real and personal property within the limits of the city of Akron, Ohio, for the purpose of providing a fund to pay both principal and interest on bonds issued by authority of the Revised Statutes of the State of Ohio, and an act of the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, passed the 22nd day of March, 1900, for the purpose of providing a fund
