The first day's registration was the largest in the history of the city. As compared with 1896 it shows a gain of 2,097.

## SPLIT

### In Church of God

#### Resulted From Action Brought by Pastor.

A law suit which has cut a big figure in the Greensburg Church of God was on trial in Common Pleas court Friday.

The action was brought by Samuel Dickerhoof, the pastor of the church, against Peter Stake, one of the parishioners. He sought to recover for alleged damage to his property because of a ditch built by the defendant. He claimed that every time he sought to interfere with the work Stake would come onto his land and begin work there.

Immediately after the action was commenced Dickerhoof was expelled from the church, it being a violation of the rules and regulations to "law." Stake did not let the case go by default. He filed an answer and cross petition. This resulted in Dickerhoof's being reinstated and Stake's being expelled. That is the way matters now stand.

 Oliver Morgan, who entered a plea of guilty to the unlawful use of dynamite, has notified the court that he desires to change his plea of guilty to one of not guilty. This action on his part will make it necessary to try every charge against those under indictment.

**DIVORCE ACTION.**  
 Jessie M. Johnson has commenced an action against Frederick Johnson for divorce. She alleges cruelty and gross neglect. They were married a year ago.

**ASKS ALIMONY.**  
 Luera Stutz, who married Charles J. Stutz, a widower with nine children four years ago, has filed an action for alimony. She says that he has neglected her and her children, who she alleges are cruel to her. It is the claim of the plaintiff that he obtained a divorce from her in Richland county by filing an affidavit that he did not know her whereabouts and that for that reason it would be necessary to get service by publication.
