

McKINLEY SWEEPS THE COUNTRY!

Elected by an Even Greater Plurality

Than Was His Good Fortune of Four Years Ago.

Carried All of the Close States, and Will Very Likely Gain Others---Mr. Bryan Gained In Popular Vote.

The Silent Vote Was With President McKinley, Which Tells the Story---Entire Republican County Ticket Elected.

(From Wednesday Morning's Extra.)

President McKinley more than held his own in the election yesterday, gaining several of the States that were for Mr. Bryan in 1896.

Both of the candidates received popular votes in excess of that cast for them in 1896.

Mr. McKinley carried all the doubtful States except Kentucky, including Maryland, Indiana, New York, Kansas and South Dakota, while the Republican committee claims that the electoral votes of Kentucky and even Nebraska will be cast for McKinley.

Never has an Administration received a more general endorsement of the American people, and the result of the election has fully justified the most extravagant claims that were made by the Republican National committee in behalf of its ticket.

The indications are also that the Republican party makes very substantial gains in the House of Representatives. Congressman Lentz, of Columbus, was defeated, and the Democrats lost other members of the Ohio delegation. At the time the Democrat went to press the result of the election in the Twentieth Ohio District was in doubt.

New York gives its vote to Mr. McKinley by a plurality of 150,000. Ohio will be Republican by about the same plurality which was given to Mr. McKinley four years ago--in the neighborhood of 50,000. Mr. Bryan gained not one State which had been claimed for Mr. McKinley.

Indications at the time that the Democrat went to press were that Mr. McKinley had carried New York, South Dakota, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, Kentucky, Minnesota and New Jersey.

Following is a complete summary of the result of the election in the various States wherein the contest was of interest.

BEIDLER

May be Defeated in the Twentieth District.

Medina, O., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Fourteen

precincts of Medina county give McKinley 2102, Bryan 1704, Beldler 1470. Harrington (Dem.) 1050, Phillips (Ind. Rep.) 856. The indications are that Mr. Harrington, the Democratic candidate

for Congress, will be elected, Cuyahoga county having given 1500 plurality against Beldler.

Cleveland, O., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Candidate Beldler carried Lake county but ran 1,500 votes behind his ticket in Cuyahoga County. At the time the Democrat's extra went to press his election was still in doubt, depending upon the action of the Medina county voters, from whom returns were tardy in arriving.

Cleveland, O., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--At 4 a.m. Cuyahoga county was still in doubt, although the Republican committee claimed it for Mr. McKinley by 2,000. They claimed the city of Cleveland by 600. The Democratic committee claims the county is still doubtful.

The election of Judge U. L. Marvin, of Akron, to succeed himself as Circuit Judge is assured. His plurality in Summit, Lorain and Medina counties will give him a substantial plurality in the district.

Lentz Defeated.

Columbus, O., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Congressman Lentz was defeated for re-election to Congress by a small plurality.

Oregon For McKinley.

Portland, Ore., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--In Oregon 134 precincts out of 752 gave McKinley 16,172, Bryan 9,156. This ratio will hold throughout the State.

Greater New York.

New York, Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Presidential returns received from all but 122 of the total of election districts in Greater New York give McKinley 236,299, Bryan 283,639.

New Hampshire by 15,000.

Concord, N. H., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Secretary Thos. H. Madigan, jr., of the Democratic State committee, concedes that the Republicans have carried the State by a plurality of 15,000.

Kentucky.

Frankfort, Ky., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--The best estimate on Kentucky indicates the certain election of the eight Democratic Congressmen out of 11. Bryan's plurality is likely to reach 15,000.

Nebraska.

Lincoln, Neb., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Special fusion managers assert that Bryan will have at least 8,000 majority. Bryan's precinct went for McKinley 208, Bryan 105.

Massachusetts Slumped.

Boston, Mass., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--As usual in Presidential years, Massachusetts went Republican today by a substantial but considerably reduced majority, giving to President McKinley 15 votes in the electoral college while W. Murray Crane was re-elected Governor.

Connecticut.

New Haven, Conn., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--10.55 p. m.--With only the larger cities and less than a dozen towns in Connecticut missing, the returns at 11 o'clock indicate the election of McKinley Electors by a plurality of 12,000 votes, and the return of all four Republican Congressmen.

Maryland.

Baltimore, Md., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Mur-

ray Van De Vere, Chairman of the Democratic state committee concedes Maryland to McKinley.

The Baltimore-American claims Maryland for McKinley by 25,000 majority, and a full Republican Congressional delegation.

Quay Wins Out.

Philadelphia, Pa., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--A bitter contest between the Quay and anti-Quay forces in the fifth Senatorial district, made up of six wards in this city, resulted in a victory for Wm. H. Berklebach, the Quay candidate by about 30,000 majority. Quay has won out throughout the entire state.

Arkansas.

Little Rock, Ark., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--There was a light vote. The vote is coming in slowly. The Democrats claim the entire Congressional delegation is elected.

Indiana.

Indianapolis, Ind., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--10 o'clock tonight returns are coming very slowly. Meagre reports received indicate Republican majority. A very heavy ballot was cast.

Kansas.

Topeka, Kas., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--There is absolutely nothing on which to base an estimate of Kansas. Only two small precincts have been completed. These show very little change.

Delaware.

Wilmington, Del., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Twenty districts out of 65 in the city of Wilmington, give McKinley 2,694, Bryan 1,855. The morning News, in an extra, announces the election of the whole Republican ticket in the State.

West Virginia.

Parkersburg, W. Va., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--The Republican State committee says the entire Republican ticket elected by a clean sweep.

South Dakota.

Yanktown, S. Dakota, Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Returns this far show a heavy Republican gain over four years ago.

New York, Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--The Journal's Pierre South Dakota special says that estimates on returns, so far received, would indicate Republican majority of ten thousand in State.

Wisconsin.

Milwaukee, Wis., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Gen. Bryant, chairman of the Republican State Central committee claims McKinley will carry the State by about 115,000.

Illinois.

Chicago, Ill., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Chairman Rowe of the State Republican committee claims 80,000 Republican plurality outside of Cook county, and 25,000 majority in Cook county.

North Dakota.

Fargo, N. Dak., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Thirty-two precincts in the State give McKinley 2,687, Bryan 1,377. The same in 1896 gave McKinley 2,438, Bryan 1,737. Chairman of the Democratic State committee concedes election of McKinley. He carries the State by 65,000 majority.

Nebraska In Doubt.

Lincoln, Neb., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Returns indicate that Nebraska has gone Republican unless the western end of the state comes to the rescue with a heavy vote.

Rhode Island.

Providence, R. I., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--McKinley has carried Rhode Island by

STATES McKINLEY CARRIED

Washington, Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Seven precincts in Washington give McKinley 713, Bryan 317. Indications at 4 o'clock were that McKinley has carried the following States: Connecticut, Delaware, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, South Dakota, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Vermont, West Virginia, Wisconsin, with a total of 247 electoral votes. Four years ago Mr. McKinley's electoral vote was 271.

Kentucky.

Lexington, Ky., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Nineteen precincts give McKinley 1,191, Bryan 889, a Republican gain of 400.

Canton Republican.

At midnight the Democrat received a dispatch from Canton announcing that the entire Republican ticket had been elected by pluralities exceeding 1,500. President McKinley carried Canton by 700, Stark county by 2,000. Congressman Taylor was re-elected by a large plurality.

Gain Republican Congressmen.

Washington, Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Senator Quay states that there will be a gain of 6 Republican Congressmen in Pennsylvania.

Even Break In New Jersey.

Trenton, N. J., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--At midnight full returns bear out the statement that New Jersey will give McKinley and Roosevelt 50,000 plurality. The Democrats have succeeded in carrying seven out of 21 counties, including Hudson, Hunter, Essex and Warren. They have made a net loss of 3 members in the upper house of the legislature. The new Senate will stand 16 Republicans to 4 Democrats, and the house will contain 44 Republicans and 15 Democrats, same as before.

MANLEY FIRST.

Wires Congratulations to President McKinley Early.

Executive Mansion, Canton, O., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--The President's first congratulations from headquarters came from Manley at New York, as follows: "Praise God from whom all blessings flow." Your triumphant re-election is conceded by Democratic managers. I tender my earnest congratulations. We are very happy at headquarters." Canton, O., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--The President is beginning to receive congratulations on his re-election.

EVERYTHING

Claimed by the Republican Executive Committee Had Been Realized.

Chicago, Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--At 11:15 tonight Henry Payne, Vice Chairman Republican National committee, said: "McKinley has surely carried every state claimed by me with the possible exception of Kentucky, and the returns

indicate that we have beaten Bryan in Nebraska.

Chairman Jones of the National Democratic Committee, at 10:05, said: "From the returns now coming in, New York is still anybody's."

Mr. Bryan's Statement.

Lincoln, Neb., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--At 12 o'clock Mr. Bryan told the newspaper correspondents that he would have no statement to make before tomorrow.

Washington Confident.

Washington, Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Republicans have the presidency and Congress beyond a doubt. At midnight nothing had been received to change the confidence in a complete Republican victory. Secretary Gage at 10:3 sent a telegram congratulating McKinley.

Omaha, Neb., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--The Omaha World, Democratic, predicts that Dunphy, the fusion candidate for Governor, will have a small majority, probably about 3,000. The state is close as between McKinley and Bryan.

Dick's Claims.

Chairman Dick of the Republican state committee, says returns up to 11 p. m. justify the claim that Ohio has given McKinley a plurality of from 75,000 to 80,000 and the election of 17 and possibly 18 out of 21 Congressmen, being a gain of two and probably three members.

Later From Illinois.

Chicago, Ill., Nov. 7.-(Spl.)--Seven hundred and twenty precincts in Illinois, outside of Cook county, gave McKinley 151,337; Bryan, 108,700. Same in '96, gave McKinley 148,701; Bryan 107,807.

Colorado Democratic.

Denver, Col., Nov. 7.-(Spl.)--Seven hundred and twenty precincts outside of Denver gave Bryan 15,207; McKinley 12,509.

Close In Cleveland.

Cleveland, O., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--One hundred and seventy precincts give McKinley 33,907; Bryan, 33,108. The same in 1896 gave McKinley 32,312; Bryan 28,797.

Cleveland, Nov. 7.-(Spl.)--One hundred precincts gave McKinley 38,065, Bryan 37,716. The same in 1896 gave McKinley 36,380, Bryan 32,752.

Columbus Republican.

Columbus, O., Nov. 7.-(Spl.)--Eighty nine precincts out of 90 in the city, indicates that McKinley carries Columbus by about 3300.

In Ohio.

Canton, O., Nov. 7.-(Spl.)--Twenty-two out of 23 precincts gave McKinley 4,009, Bryan 3,155.

Republican Gain.

Columbus, O., Nov. 7.-(Spl.)--Three hundreds of Hamilton Cuyahoga, Franklin and Lucas counties gave McKinley 74,440, Bryan 61841.

Franklin For McKinley.

Columbus, O., Nov. 7.-(Spl.)--Eighty precincts in Franklin county give McKinley 31,818, Bryan 12,734.

Claimed Nebraska.

Omaha, Neb., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--The Proprietor of the Omaha Bee, Republican, says all indications point to the election of Dietrich the Republican candidate for Governor, by 3,000

Kansas by 40,000.

Topeka, Kas., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--The Kansas Republican committee still claims the State for McKinley by 40,000, and the election of the entire Republican Congressional delegation.

Indianapolis, Ind., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--At one o'clock returns from 500 precincts show a net Republican gain of 2,452. This would indicate a plurality for McKinley of about 34,000 in the State.

Chicago, Ill., Nov. 6.-(Spl.)--Seven hundred and twenty precincts of Cook county, gave McKinley 140,741, Bryan 109,761. Same in 1896 gave McKinley 138,896, Bryan 109,761.
