Murderer of Teresa Keating Arrested.

Tell-Tale Bangle May Lead to Conviction.

Rochester, N. Y., Nov. 24.—(Spl.)—In Herbert Fuller, 23 years old, a shoe cutter, from Canada, who has been arrested here, the police believe they have found the fiendish slayer of Teresa Keating. It has been clearly learned that Fuller inquired at 9 o'clock on Wednesday morning (two hours before the girl's body was found) of a resident of Rochester, whether the body had been found.

The chief evidence, however, is the tell-tale bangle made from a ten-cent Canadian coin, which was found near the girl's body. A chum of Fuller's had often noticed this bangle fastened on his coat and on the morning after the murder he noticed it was missing.


