WATCH NIGHT.

An Elaborate Program

Has Been Arranged For the Occasion.

Cause Appeals to Every Good Citizen.

Hope to Raise Funds For the Red Cross.

The Red Cross entertainment and watch night meeting to be held on the night of Dec. 31, will be one of the most successful gatherings of the kind ever held in this city.

The fact that the funds raised through the sale of tickets for admission to this entertainment will go to the National Red Cross Association, for its use in relieving the afflicted and distressed, should be a motive for every man, woman and child in the city, if they cannot afford to purchase tickets, to at least contribute something to swell the fund for so worthy a cause.

The committees of citizens in charge of the entertainment, who are laboring so industriously to make the affair the great success it should be, realize that the present holiday season is a poor time to attempt to hold such an entertainment and raise funds. There are so many social entertainments, parties, church affairs, etc., that it is a difficult matter to attract attention to this movement.

There is no cause, no matter how worthy, wherein Akron citizens should manifest more interest than in this Red Cross movement. Every citizen of any size in the nation will on Monday night, Dec. 31, hold a similar entertainment and watch night meeting and raise funds for the use of this great charitable organization. Accordingly the citizens of Akron should not be lacking in liberality and public spiritedness in joining with her neighboring cities in the matter. The last hours of the present century is a very appropriate time to pay tribute to an organization that has done so much for suffering humanity.

The Red Cross society was organized at Geneva, Switzerland, in 1863. Its object was to relieve, as much as possible, the sufferings of wounded and sick soldiers on the field of battle. The organization grew in strength until societies were instituted in every European country.

America was not slow in taking up the cause and advancing the work of the society. It broadened its field of work, and so strengthened its numbers that today the great center of the Red Cross organization is in the United States. The American societies, instead of merely extending relief to the wounded soldiers on the battlefield, have advanced aid to sufferers in all the terrible catastrophes that have occurred in this country in modern years. At the Johnston flood and the Galveston harbor, the noble Red Cross workers were on the scene, and worked with superhuman efforts to relieve the terrible suffering.

Think of the noble work of this great organization in the past. Imagine what it can and will do in the future, if the people of the nation assist it materially, and you cannot resolve that it is not your duty to aid financially the movement now progressing in its cause.
