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AN ORDINANCE. To reestablish the grade on South High street, between Exchange street and Chestnut street.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Akron, Ohio, that the grade on South High street, from Exchange street to Chestnut street, be and the same is hereby re-established with reference to and above the city datum plane as follows, to-wit: At the south line of Exchange street; At the west line of High street 190.50 feet. At the center of High street 193.50 feet. At the east line of High street 200.75 feet. At 27 feet northerly from the north line of Chestnut street; At the west line of High street, 202.50 feet. At 15 feet from the west line of High street 202.50 feet. At the center of High street, 203 feet. At 15 feet from the east line of High street 203.50 feet. At the east line of High street, 205 feet. At the southerly line of Chestnut street; At the west line of High street, 206.2 feet. At 15 feet from the west line of High street 200 feet. At the center of High street, 200.50 feet. At 15 feet from the east line of High street, 201 feet. At the east line of High street, 202.50 feet with true planes connecting adjacent elevations.
