They will produce a brand new drama from the pen of T. Jackson, Esq., entitled, "The Wall of the Wang Doodle," or "Why the Lion Roareth," in six acts, and eighteen blood thirsty tableaux.

Mrs. Fiske, last week, practically closed her extended far Western tour by entering the Middle West at Milwaukee, where she played a very successful engagement at the handsome Pabst theater. Since last November, when she left Boston, Mrs. Fiske has crossed and re-crossed the continent, from Chicago through Illinois, Iowa and Kansas, touching St. Joseph, Mo., to Denver and Salt Lake, and thence to San Francisco, where after a phenomenal season she visited the prominent cities of the Northwest, including Portland, Ore., everywhere being greeted by crowded houses. For the ensuing fortnight she will play in the prominent cities in Northern Illinois and Indiana and on April 3, she will open an engagement at Louisville, Ky., where she has not played in two years. Mrs. Fiske will visit Akron before returning to New York.

Directly the Appletons announced a new romance entitled "Betsy Ross," they were flooded with managerial applications for the dramatic rights. These, however, had been safeguarded by Wm. A. Brady and Joseph R. Grismer, who had previously arranged for a play of that name to be produced in Philadelphia next April.

SAYS CONSUMPTION IS CONTAGIOUS. Dr. Kohler Would Have Physicians Report All Cases. The Legislature May Take Action Regarding This--It Has Been Done Elsewhere.

"The time when consumption will be declared by law to be a contagious disease is not far away," said Dr. A. A. Kohler, City Health Officer to a reporter for the Democrat, referring to the action of the Board of Health of Philadelphia, in instructing physicians to report all cases of consumption. "Physicians here in Akron should be required to report contagious diseases as regularly as they do diphtheria or measles," Dr. Kohler continued. "But the State Board of Health will have to act on the matter, after it has first received the attention of the Legislature. I should not be surprised that if in the next session of the General Assembly the question would be taken up." Dr. Kohler does not believe it would be necessary to maintain a strict quarantine in cases of consumption, but restrictions should be placed on those who are near consumptives and on the unfortunates themselves. The Health Officer cited cases which had come within his own observation convincing him of the contagious nature of the disease. In one instance a strong, robust husband who took care of his wife during her illness and ultimately death from consumption was threatened by the disease himself a little later, but after two years of constant care his strong constitution was able to throw off the trouble. Akron contains a smaller percentage of consumptives than Cleveland, and many other cities, it is said, but it is true that a large part of the deaths occurring in this city are due to diseases of the respiratory organs.
