**Count of Primary Vote**

**Shows That Mr. Beery Won Second Place, Instead of Mr. Lionel S. Pardee.**

**\$500 Required by Committee to Conduct the Primaries.**

In the primary election figures published this morning, it was shown that Lionel S. Pardee had secured second place in the race for County Prosecutor. Four precincts had not yet been heard from. These give second place to Mr. Clyde F. Beery, he, according to the official count, receiving 114 votes more than Mr. Pardee. It cost \$500 to hold the County Republican primaries. Of this amount \$425 has been collected. The committee will be obliged to collect \$75 more. There are 68 precincts in this county; 34 in this city and 29 in the townships. **RESULTS IN OHIO CITIES.**

Cleveland gave Tom L. Johnson a plurality of 6,033 for Mayor. The official vote stood Johnson, Dem., 35,791; Akers, Rep., 29,758.

Hon. Samuel Jones was re-elected Mayor of Toledo by a plurality of from 2,500 to 3,000.

John N. Hinkle was elected Mayor of Columbus over Taylor, Repub., by a plurality of 381.

Upper Sandusky, Norwalk, Hamilton, Sidney, Ashland, Millersburg, Marysville, Bucyrus, Kent, Marion, Sandusky Urbana, Zanesville, Wapakoneta, Mansfield, Lima, Kenton Fremont, Vermillion, Bryan and Elmore went Democratic at the municipal elections Monday.

The cities where the Republicans elected their tickets were: Youngstown, Chagrin Falls, Elyria, Stembenville, Delaware, Paulding, Wauseon, Bloomdale Bowling Green, Fayette, Warren, Cadiz, Ravenna, Findlay, Springfield, Marietta and Pistoria.

One of the most interesting features of the election in Youngstown was the vote on the proposition to change the form of the municipal government from that of the City Commissioner system to that of Toledo. A special from Youngstown says:

The Republican city and township tickets were successful throughout. Conroy for City Solicitor leading with about 1,000 majority. Republicans elect six out of ten Councilmen, making that body stand Republicans 13, Democrats 7. The Board of Education is also overwhelmingly Republican. The question of advancing the city's grade was defeated two to one. The vote was very light, but both parties suffered about equally.
