AMONG The Filipinos at Bangar.

How They Work, and Obtain Amusement.

Scenes of Market Day Like a County Fair.

Private Chas. Burch Describes Interesting Observations.

In a letter to his sister, Private Chas. Burch, an Akron boy, with American troops in the Philippines, describes the condition of the natives, and their methods of transacting business and obtaining amusement and pleasure. He says the natives are Catholics and attend services regularly whenever possible. Services are held on both Friday and Sunday. On Friday, Mr. Burch says, the natives procure a band and march through the streets in the afternoon from one church to another.

The letter is written from Bangar, and dated March 22. It follows in part:

Monday is market day. It seems as if the natives drop their work and flock to the market. The market place is quite large, enclosed by a fence with long low sheds to protect their goods. It reminds me of a county fair. In place of the races, however, the natives have cock fights. I have seen as high as \$100 gold up, on the results. The Chinese are the business men here. They are lined up with their dry goods spread out and have almost everything in the line of cloth. Next come the Filipino women with their vegetables. You never see the men buying or selling; they leave that to the women, and lounge about looking for a crap game. They are great gamblers and will never leave a game till their last cent is gone. Cock fights are their greatest sport. They get so excited it is comical to watch them. You never see them fight, although I have often heard of them fighting. In their fights, it is said, the bolo is used. The fellows have often got little boys together and tried to teach them the American style, but they cannot understand the use of the fists. Such contests generally ends up in pulling each other's hair, that is, if they have any hair to pull. The men all wear their hair short, but the women have beautiful black tresses, which reach below their knees.

At Badoc there was a senorita who had dark, red hair. We called her the "Irish woman." There are quite a number of people here who are albino. I have seen a dozen, at least. Each town has so many barrios to look after. In the Bangar district there are over 30 barrios, each barrio has its officers. Most of these barrios are in the mountains. They are ordered to report if any insurgents are in their neighborhood. It causes us a great deal of unnecessary hiking, as their reports are frequently untrue.

I received a bundle of papers since I received your last letter, and am glad to hear of the improvements to be made in South Akron. Akron must be a large city. The street car lines are being extended, I see.

I notice that cautions are also being taken away from soldiers at home. There are no cautions in the Philippines, and I believe this is a good thing, but I am doubtful as to whether the plan will succeed at home.
