Won't Need to Stay So Long In Workhouse.

Benjamin Rudominsky was in Mayor's court Friday, on charge of receiving stolen goods—brass, said to have been given him by Wm. Wallace and Ed. Smith, each of whom were on Thursday fined \$25 and costs and sentenced to 30 days to the workhouse. He pleaded not guilty, and the case was continued to Thursday. Wallace and Smith will not be sent to the workhouse until after this trial, as they are to be witnesses. The time they stay here will be remitted from the workhouse term.

James Gauthier was fined the costs for calling Mrs. Christina Baker names. A witness against Gauthier was his wife. She and he do not live together, and in talking to Mrs. Baker last Tuesday he is alleged to have accused her of permitting Mrs. Gauthier to take men to her house.

An affidavit has been filed, accusing John McGuire of miscalling Bertha Ries and Dessie Phinney. The case will be heard Tuesday.

Mrs. Lillian Donovan has filed complaint against James Donovan, accusing him of assault and battery.

TEST OF DEMOCRACY.

Chairman Johnson Says It Is Allegiance to the Kansas City Platform.

Chicago, July 19.—(Spl.)—The full text of the interview published by J. G. Johnson, of Kansas, member of the Democratic National Committee, and chairman of the Democratic National Executive Committee in relation to the recent Ohio Democratic convention, follows:

"The Ohio state convention is the first that has been held since the commencement of the newspaper talk about reorganization of the Democratic party in the interest of a certain class of men who seem to glory in the fact that they helped defeat it in the last two national campaigns. They seem to have made the issue at Columbus a negative condemnation of

Zeozaya endeavored to accompany the Mexicans, but he was unable to secure a place. Last night just as the bull fight began, Zeozaya walked up to Mr. McGarvie and made an appeal. He was informed that there was nothing for him to do. Zeozaya drew a revolver and fired at Mr. McGarvie, the ball grazing his arm. He then turned the weapon on himself and fired. The bullet passed through his heart and he dropped dead.

Wild Stories Had Little Weight

And the Accused Escaped Easily.

What Nervousness Caused a Colored Girl to Do.

B. C. Beechy, accused of attempted assault upon Mrs. Carrie Morris, at her home, 170 Ridge st., Thursday forenoon, was fined \$10 and costs by Mayor Doyle Friday morning. He was charged with assault and battery, but the complaining witness tried to show criminal assault.

Beechy is a picture agent, and, according to his testimony, went to Mrs. Morris' home to deliver a picture. He said she had thrown out inducements leading him to believe her an immoral woman, but he denied any attempt on his part at serious offense. Mrs. Morris, alleged that Beechy had entered her home, tried to tie her hands and otherwise misuse her. Isabel Coleman, a colored girl who lives with Mrs. Morris, was in the house, and claimed to have seen the alleged assault. She said the incident made her so nervous that she ran and shut all the doors, and pulled down the window blinds.

The Mayor placed no stress on the stories told by the women, and as Beechy pleaded guilty to assault and

battery, was merely fined on that charge. Mayor Doyle also said it looked as if there were collusion in the stories told by the women.


For a Populist Convention.

Middle-of-the-Roaders Want to Name a Ticket.

Cincinnati, O., July 19.—(Spl.)—J. A. Parker, chairman of the People's party national committee, has issued a call for a conference of Ohio Populists and all those who favor the amalgamation of independent reform forces into an allied third party, to meet in Colun

bus July 30, to place a state ticket in the field. He has also issued a call for a national conference of Populists and others to be held in Kansas City Sept. 17 to 19, to ally all reform parties which shall agree with the amended Populist platform.

A call has been issued for a conference in Columbus, July 31 of those Democrats who oppose the platform adopted at the Democratic state convention last week, "because it does not mention Bryan, free silver, or the Kansas City platform." Today's call for a conference of the Populists, the night previous to the conference of "disseminating Democrats," is considered as a movement for an attempt to form a fusion third party in the pending election in Ohio.
