

TO SAVE HIS SISTER.

College Boy Became a Stowaway and Traveled 12,500 Miles.

Waterville, N. Y., Oct. 12.—No one is more intensely interested in the fate of Miss Stone at the hands of the Bulgarian brigands than young Wesley Hook, of Waterville. As tramp and stowaway, young Hook traveled 12,500 miles, always dreading that the Boxers had made captive or murdered his sister. She is Miss Elsie Hook, a teacher in a Methodist mission. At the end of his arduous journey in which he suffered frightful privations, this devoted brother happily learned that his sister was safe. He returned as he had gone, working his way when he could; stowing himself away on ships

at Syracuse University when the Boxers began to slay the missionaries. "My sister Elsie is everything to my mother and to me" said young Hook today. "I made up my mind to save her from the Boxers or to avenge her death should I be too late to rescue her. I had spent my little money for my expenses at college, but I determined to go to China anyhow. My blood ran cold when I read of the Boxer atrocities and thought my sister might be subjected to them. Heaven grant that the brigands' hope of ransom may save Miss Stone from agony and death. "I arrived at Shanghai on August 8,

and trains when work was refused him. Wesley Hook is a sturdy, bronzed self-reliant young fellow of 20 years. He told his story recently, modestly. He had just finished his freshman year

and ran through the streets to the house where I learned my sister had fled. She was gone, the house was closed. Elsie and all the mission teachers had fled to Japan. Imagine my relief. My sister was safe at least. With a light heart, I went to work at moving furniture. After some weeks, my sister returned. Never was a woman so astonished as she when she saw me. "I wished to reenter college this fall, so I started home last May," concluded this self-confident young American. "My greatest desire is to learn that Miss Stone has escaped her perils as did Elsie."

Was Fined \$10 and Costs For Working on Sunday.

Mexico, Mo., Oct. 12.—(Spl.)—A jury here has found Godfrey Winzer, a German farmer, guilty of working on the Sabbath. He was found guilty on two charges, and was fined \$10 and costs in each case. The law under which the indictments were found is as follows: "Every person who shall either labor himself or compel his apprentice or servant or any other person under his charge or control to labor or perform

any work other than the household offices of the daily necessity or other works of necessity or charity, or who shall be guilty of hunting game or shooting on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be fined not exceeding \$50." Winzer was accused of defying the Sabbath law by scalding hogs, whitewashing trees, stacking oats and straw, and rendering lard on Sunday.

The positions of the Turkish and Bulgarian troops that are hunting the brigands are also indicated on the map.
