DANGERS LURKING IN MILK.

Health departments, in the larger cities are beginning to realize the dangers which lurk beneath the surface of much of the milk now being supplied for daily consumption. Many children and invalids have come to an untimely death by coming in contact with disease germs, such as typhoid, scarlet fever, consumption, etc., in impure milk. To avoid these dangers milk inspectors agree: First, That a more rigid inspection of the dairy be required. Second, that milk be cooled as quickly as possible after coming from the cow. Third, that the only safe method known for removing impurities and killing disease germs in milk is by the clarifying and pasteurizing process. Fourth, that it should be delivered to city customers in sealed glass jars, which have previously been carefully sterilized. In every community where this method has been tried, the general health of the community has been benefited.

ORGANIZING

To Collect For McKinley Memorial.

"I had a conference with Governor Nash, last week, concerning the plans for a McKinley memorial," said Captain Aaron Wagoner, committeeman for the 19th Congressional district of the State, Saturday, "and the plan we evolved for the district is this: I have already appointed a committee of five, to take care of collections for Akron and in Summit county, and will appoint a committeeman for each other county in the district. "Ohio's apportionment will be \$100,000, and the Governor has assured me that not more than \$1500 will be expected from Summit county. "Whatever may be contributed above this amount can be used for a memorial to the late President in this county. This was the original plan of Akron people but not wishing to interfere with the plans of the national committee, we laid aside our work and took up theirs. "I believe this announcement will help the collections for the memorial in this county."
