The fact that a goodly portion of the fence surrounding Buchtel field was blown down by yesterday's and Sunday's storm is another small setback to the operations of the city base ball league. START POSTPONED.

HIS WIFE'S BODY

Was Found in a Lane and Foul Play Is Feared.

Springfield, O., April 1.—Mrs. Alice Hall, wife of E. H. Hall, living south of the city, was found dead at the entrance to the lane leading to her home about 12 o'clock Sunday night and there are suspicions of foul play. Mrs. Hall had driven to this city Sunday and when she failed to return her husband started a search for her. He found the horse and buggy standing near the stable. With Gilbert Smith, his farm hand, he searched and came upon the dead body of Mrs. Hall. She had been dead for several hours and the only mark upon the body was a small cut on the right side. Her husband thinks that she was strangled by someone while in this city. Colonel Bennett was notified and is making an investigation of the case.
