The differences which arose among the local promoters of base ball have resolved themselves into a condition where the league is simply working hard for its own interests, paying no special attention to the competition which is bound to come, and the outside teams are working that they may not be behind when the time comes to begin the season and play the game in a creditable manner.

The result of this competition will doubtless be better base ball than Akron has had for many years, for the management of each team realizes that there are expenses which must be met, making it necessary to draw crowds, and to play such ball as will continue to draw. On days when the league plays and other teams also have a game in Akron, it is predicted that there will be a considerable division of patronage and a corresponding division of the profits.

EXPECT IT TO LAST.
The schedule for the Akron base ball league comprises a series of games which will end with several contests on Labor Day, provided there are no postponed games, which will have to be played later. July 4, and other holidays are well taken care of by the schedule, and on those days there will be both morning and afternoon games, at Bachtel field and at Silver lake.

After the season has ended, it is probable that there will be a series of games, either with teams from the Cleveland city league, or with teams right here in the city. It is expected that base ball enthusiasm this year will last until cold weather.

For His Awful Crime.

"They Deserved to Die" Says Wm. Lane,

Who Shot Mrs. Furbush and Her Daughters.

Philadelphia, Pa., April 2.—Wm. Lane, the negro, who yesterday murdered Mrs. Ella J. Furbush, and her daughter, Madeline, and fatally shot Eloise Furbush, another daughter, was held today to await the action of the Coroner. Lane expressed no regret for his crime. When asked what caused him to kill the woman and child he said: "They deserved to die."

At the hospital today it was said that there was little hope for the recovery of Eloise.

Charles M. Furbush, the reputed husband of the murdered woman, whose right name was Ella Jarden, spent last night in the house where the crime was committed, but the policemen who are guarding the premises said he was not in a condition to make a statement.

MRS. ALTGELD

Is In Need and Friends Raise Money For Her.

Chicago, April 2.—Friends of the late John P. Altgeld are at work raising funds for his widow by subscription. They have undertaken to supply her with cash for her needs for the rest of her life. Just now they hope to make the fund reach a total of \$20,000. This action is considered necessary by the friends of the late Governor. He is said to have left his widow penniless. The home in her name is said to be heavily mortgaged, and there was not a dollar of assets. Clarence H. Darrow and ex-Congressman Noonan head the Committee of Relief. Mrs. Altgeld has been an invalid for several years and she has been prostrated since her husband's death.

TERRIBLE

Crime With Which He Stands Charged.

Testimony Against Toombs In Chicago Court.

Chicago, April 2.—Robert Keissig, whose accusation brought about the arrest of Louis G. Toombs for the murder of Carrie Larsen, last winter, was placed on the witness stand yesterday. The court room was crowded with people who listened to the details of the most revolting crime in the history of Chicago for years past. The prisoner appeared interested, but his interest seemed to be absolutely impersonal.

A rope with which Keissig said the unfortunate woman was bound, and pieces of iron with which the witness said the body was weighed, were produced and admitted as evidence. Keissig said that Toombs had gone to an employment agency, and having met Carrie Larsen, promised her work as assistant cook on the boat Peerless then lying here fast in the ice. The boy Keissig, who was 19 years old, averred that on the night of the murder he was lying in his bunk on the boat. Toombs, he said, was undressed and also lying down. Carrie Larsen was in her state room. In order to get her out he said, Toombs ordered her to come out and cook his supper.

She left the security of her room, only to be attacked by Toombs. He assaulted her, the witness said, and so frantically did she battle that in doing so Toombs choked her to death. Toombs laid down for awhile, leaving the body stretched out on the cabin floor. Keissig, horrified into speechlessness, still stared from his berth. What happened after Toombs again arose is not printable. The witness shuddered as he told the story, and there were many averted heads in the court room. Attorney Barnes said that this was the first time in the history of Chicago that such a charge had been uttered against an alleged murderer.

The witness regained his composure when asked to tell of the disposal of the body. He declared that Toombs tied the rope around it, weighted it, and then ordered Keissig to help him carry it to a hole in the ice near the boat. This was done, and Keissig said that for some days afterward he was afraid to speak, fearing that Toombs would kill him.

RUSHED

Into New Land Ahead of Time.

"Sooners" Were Nine Hours Ahead of the Opening.

Los Angeles, Cal., April 2.—The San Jacinto forest reserve land in Riverside county has been opened to entry. Only seven claimants appeared at the land office in this city and these had been waiting for two weeks.

It is understood, however, that nine hours previous to the hour named in the proclamation, a crowd of men in wagons and on horse-back and on foot made a wild rush on the land from the reservation borders. Those who registered at the local land office also had "rushers" at the reservation. The law states that homesteaders or settlers shall have three months in which to file notice of location, after taking up claims. Those who squatted on the property will claim precedence by reason of being on the ground first. A long contest is anticipated.
