**TURK OVER - LORD
FEARS DEMON RUM**

Isn't It Pathetic to Note How a "Caught-With-the-Goods on Him" Turk Can Get If Forced to It?

Essad Bey, who represents the national Turkish party in Paris, implores the American people to save the Turks from the demon rum. During the war, when the Turks were in contact with the Germans and the Armenians, they preserved their vigor, but since they have been subjugated they have come in contact with the whiskey drinking English and wine bibbing French, and in consequence their primitive virtues are being corrupted.

Essad Bey says that wherever the English and French go cafes follow. He says the English are flooding Palestine with hard liquors and the French are soaking Armenia with wine. Greeks and Italians are making a wine tube out of Smyrna. Inasmuch as a Turk going home soused makes two or three wives unhappy—even in those days of reduced harems—the case is at least doubly pathetic. "Father, dear father, come home to us now," may have been a solo in the United States, but it is a chorus in Turkey.

Contact with the Germans gave the Turks an incentive to amuse themselves with the Armenians, and they were not such easy victims of vicious suggestions as they are now, when all they have to do is sit around all day and remember that they are Turks. A consciousness of a dismal estate frequently drives a man to hard liquor.

Some leaders of thought say that a man deprived of alcohol broods more upon his estate. Samuel Gompers says so. He said if the workman were deprived of his beer he would become morose. He would say that a case of beer per capita would settle the coal strike. Attorney General Palmer has not been able to settle it. Mr. Garfield has not been able to settle it. Secretary Wilson has not been able to settle it. Mr. Gompers may be right. It may have been a bad thing for the Turks not to have had liquor. They had their excitement in murdering Armenians and Macedonians, when they could catch them. Possibly a little drinking would have kept them from dwelling too much upon the fact that they were Turks. Editorial writers sometimes would like to have something to make them forget that they are editorial writers. Not having it, they go out and chop up a few public characters.

Whatever the merits of the case, we think that Essad Bey has made a strong appeal to the greatest dry nation in the world. We ought to help the Turks. It is the strongest argument for a mandate we have heard. The French and English are corrupting the Turkish nation and we ought to do something about it.—Chicago Tribune.


