BIG HEALTH PAGEANT NOW BEING REHEARSED
Five Hundred in June Spectacle at Fair Grounds

Miss Annette Brane of Columbus has arrived in Medina to begin the work of training the various groups of school children of Medina county for the big health pageant which is to take place June 23 and 24 at the Fair Grounds.

Miss Brane comes to Medina from Warren where she trained the children of Trumbull county for the big outdoor spectacle held in Warren last Friday and Saturday.

The pageant, "Health Wins," tells the story of what the Modern Health Crusade is doing in the schools of Medina county under the supervision of Superintendent C. B. Ulery. No county in the state has done more in promoting this method of teaching health to the children than Medina county during the past year and the pageant is expected to prove a big success here.

More than five hundred children from the rural schools and from Medina will participate in the performance, which will be staged on the track in front of the grand stand. The exhibitions will be given in the evening in order to get the effects of the pageant lights which are a big feature of the entertainment.

Mr. J. C. Sullivan, director of the pageant for the Ohio Public Health association, will come to Medina later to supervise the final arrangements and look after the installation of the lights and settings for the performance.
