TWO HELD FOR TRIAL ON ASSAULT CHARGE

Frank Craig and Lee Cammarn, Chippewa Lake youths, were given a hearing before Justice of Peace W. P. Ainsworth last Thursday afternoon on a charge of assault and battery. The hearing had been set for the previous week, but was postponed upon request of counsel for defense.

The alleged offense occurred on the night of Sunday, July 17, following a dance held in a grove near the lake, and was the result of a disagreement as to who should have the privilege of escort to two young ladies from the dance. The latter are Alice Smith and Madge Murphy of Lakewood, O. The victims of the alleged assault are Leonard Sims and Jack and Morris Tolen, all of Cleveland.

The girls were at the hearing on Thursday and testified substantially as follows:

That they accompanied Craig and a youth by the name of Rohrer to the dance. Subsequently a difference arose between the latter and his lady friend, the latter refusing his further attentions. Meanwhile she accepted the attention of one of the Cleveland boys. When time to go home, Craig's fair one announced to him her intention of accompanying the girl she came with, and both girls with their new escorts started away. They had not proceeded far when, according to the girls, Craig and Cammarn attacked the Tolens and Sims, beating them up considerably.

At the hearing Thursday the charge of assault on Sims was dismissed, but Craig and Cammarn were bound over to the grand jury under a bond of \$200 each, which was furnished.

F. W. Woods is counsel for plaintiffs and Arthur Van Epp counsel for defense.

AUTO RUNS OVER CHILD

The 11-year-old daughter of Fred Webber of North Huntington street had a narrow escape from death last Friday afternoon and fortunately sustained but minor injuries, when struck by an automobile near the electric station.

An interurban car had just stopped at the station to unload passengers, when the little Webber girl darted across the street ahead of it, and directly in the path of an auto driven by A. W. Oatman. The latter was unable to stop in time to avoid hitting the child and she was knocked down and one wheel passed over her body. She was carried into the home of W. H. Gardner, near by, and a physician summoned, later being conveyed to her home.

The injuries consisted of a cut on the back of the girl's head which bled profusely, and several bruises about the body. She is recovering rapidly and is already able to be about.



