The following short geography lesson of Ohio is given for the benefit of the young reader: Ohio was admitted into the Union as a State in 1802, and extends from east to west 224 miles, and from north to south 200 miles; has an area of 38,964 square miles, or 25,570,000 acres. Of this 22,000,000 acres are occupied by farms. The average size of Ohio farms is 115 acres. The coal beds in the east covers about one-fourth of the State. In respect of size Ohio ranks 24th. The Ohio river forms the boundary of 426 miles. The extent of the lake coast is 230 miles. The State is divided into 38 counties. Ashtabula is the largest. Cincinnati, Cleveland, Columbus, Dayton and Toledo are the five largest cities. There are 306 newspapers in Ohio. Nearly 4,500 miles of railway are in operation. The highest point in Ohio is at Bellefontaine, Logan County, which is 1,540 feet above the sea level. The soil of the greater part of the State is supposed to be the deposit of icebergs during the glacial period. The first Governor of Ohio as a territory was Arthur St. Clair, as a State, Edward Tiffin. Marietta was settled in 1788, and is the oldest town in the State, and Celina, we may add, is situated on the banks of the largest reservoir in the world.
