EMPLOYEE OF FORD MOTOR CO. HAS WAGE RAISED TO \$30 PER WEEK.

Lad, Who is Sole Support of Widowed Mother and Sister, Comes Under Generous Class of the Graduated Scale.

Philadelphia, Feb. 4.—When J. Phillip Morris, 16, office boy, went home from work at night with a week's wage of \$30 in his pocket, he was perfectly willing to agree with his employers that he is the highest paid office boy in the country.

SAYS HE'LL REMAIN CHIEF OF TAMMANY

Murphy Replies to Resolution Reading Him Out of Democratic Party.

New York, Feb. 4.—"I am the leader of Tammany Hall and intend to continue as leader," was Charles W. Murphy's reply to the resolution adopted by the National Democratic club reading him out of the party.

Judge O'Dwyer Replies. Edward F. O'Dwyer, chief justice of the city courts and president of the club, when he heard Murphy's reply, said:

"So Mr. Murphy is going to continue as leader of Tammany Hall. Well, I know of no one who is going down there and evict him from his desk by force. In fact, I know of no self-respecting, honorable man who would be willing to go in there and occupy a desk in that den of infamy which has always stood for graft and corruption. The very name of Tammany is odious. Organizes Movement.

"Let Mr. Murphy remain there and continue to meet his business associates. Henceforth, the headquarters of the Democratic party of New York city will be at No. 617 Fifth avenue, the clubhouse of the National Democratic club."

Judge O'Dwyer announced that he proposed to begin at once to organize a movement to take the Democratic organization away from Murphy and Tammany at the fall primaries.

THIRD IN FAMILY DIES

MOTHER IN JAIL CHARGED WITH KILLING HUSBAND BY GIVING POISON.

Little Valley, N. Y., Feb. 4.—Laura Buffum, the 12-year-old daughter of Mrs. Cynthia Buffum, has just died. Mrs. Buffum is in the county jail charged with murdering her husband, Willis Buffum, by giving him poison.

Laura's death is the third in the family since last spring. Norris, a four-year-old boy, died in May. The father died on August 27. Four boys were ill, but recovered.

At the time of her indictment and arrest, Mrs. Buffum made a confession to District Attorney George W. Cole in which she is alleged to have admitted placing poison in the food prepared for the family to get them out of the way so that she could marry Ernest Frahm, a young farmer, also under indictment in connection with the death of Buffum.

To Abolish Insanity as Defense. Albany, N. Y., Feb. 4.—The abolition of insanity as a defense to a crime is the object of a bill introduced in the state legislature by Assemblyman William T. Simpson of New York city.

It is specified a person on trial for a criminal offense is presumed to have been sane. In case of murder, the penalty would be death, whether sane or insane.

Albany, N. Y., Feb. 4.—Former Gov. Sulzer made his maiden speech as a state assemblyman in support of a motion to bring before the house the Schaap resolution for a state wide graft investigation.
