AN OUTSIDE VIEW.

What the Alliance Leader Has to Say of the Board of Election Cases.

MONEY MATTERS AND BUSINESS AFFAIRS.

It seems the expansion of loans by the New York banks during the past year was \$100,000,000, during the past two years \$200,000,000, and since election day 1896 \$270,000,000.

The totals of bank loans at different periods is remarkable: \$442,040,000 on November 7, 1896; \$712,000,000, December 24, 1898, an increase of \$270,000,000 in a little over two years.

Expansion of loans shows increase of deposits and cash on hand, for they must keep on hand a reserve of one-fourth of their deposits, but banks lend four times the amount of cash deposits usually.

Stock gambling, like all speculation, is liable to collapse at any time. If foreign bankers throw a few millions of American securities on the market for sale, an alarm, and such a scare plays the mischief with stock gambling and gamblers and speculators.

The annual report of the Massillon State Hospital for the insane states that the institution has been open but a brief time, and most of the expenses so far have been in the way of stocking up for service.

THE OPEN DOOR.

"The open door" is a new phrase, at least new in its application, meaning freedom of trade, unfettering commerce, abolishing restrictions such as protective tariffs impose.

Now that the United States has got Cuba, Porto Rico, the Philippines and Hawaii, other nations are somewhat anxious to know whether this country will bring these islands under our restrictive tariff policy.

He open door as to China has been much talked of lately, Great Britain leading the way, when Russia was aiming and plotting to control China, cut out Britain and monopolize the China trade.

Britain is not afraid of competing with other nations for the China or any other trade. Her policy is the open door to the world over. She has a large trade with the Philippines and is naturally anxious for a fair show under our management.

We know little of the Filipinos and they are not much acquainted with us as yet; but it seems they have had for some time a government of their own to which they have been giving a fair measure of support.

CLEAR UP FILIPINOS.

Day Specifically Ordered No Negotiations.

CONSULS RECEIVED STRICT ORDERS When They Sent Word of Conference With Aguinaldo and Agoncillo They Were Told to Avoid Committing the U. S. Government to Any Terms.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 6.—Along with the peace treaty, which had been already submitted to the senate and which was made public, there was given a lot of correspondence, etc., including that which passed between the department of state and the United States consuls at Manila, Hongkong and Singapore relative to the Philippines.

April 28, Consul Pratt telegraphed from Singapore: "Aguinaldo goes, my instance, Hongkong, arrange for Dewey to operate at Singapore and Manila." June 20, Secretary Day telegraphed Pratt, among other things: "Avoid any negotiations with Philippine insurgents."

Secretary Day again admonished Pratt to be cautious to create no impression that might embolden the government and lead to misunderstanding in its future action.

It is understood that any obligations assumed in this treaty by the United States with respect to Cuba are limited to the time of its occupancy thereof, but it will, upon the termination of its occupancy, require any government established in the island to assume the same obligations.

THE TREATY OF PEACE.

Partial Text of the Articles Arranged Between the United States and Spain.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 6.—The peace treaty, which has been already submitted to the senate, was made public, it being in part as follows:

Spain relinquishes all claim of sovereignty over and title to Cuba.

Spain cedes to the United States the island of Puerto Rico, the island of Guam, the island of Manila, the Marianas or Larones.

The United States will, for the term of ten years from the date of the exchange of the ratifications of the present treaty, admit Spanish subjects and their families to the Philippine islands on the same terms as ships and merchandise of the United States.

of the present treaty, and that to Spain, at its own cost, the Spanish soldiers taken as prisoners of war on the capture of Manila by the American forces.

Article VI. Spain will, upon the signature of the present treaty, release all prisoners of war, and all persons detained or imprisoned for political offenses in connection with the insurrection in Cuba and the Philippines and the war with the United States.

Article VII. The United States will release all persons made prisoners of war by the American forces, and will undertake to obtain the release of all Spanish prisoners in the hands of the insurgents in Cuba and the Philippines.

Article VIII. This covers cession of barracks, buildings, warships, archives, etc., to the United States.

Article IX. This covers rights of Spanish subjects, etc., who must within a year declare their allegiance to Spain, or be considered citizens of the United States.

Article X. The inhabitants of the territories over which Spain relinquishes or cedes her sovereignty shall be secured in the free exercise of their religion.

Article XI. The Spaniards residing in the territories over which Spain relinquishes or cedes her sovereignty shall be subject to matters civil as well as criminal to the jurisdiction of the country where they reside, etc.

Article XII. Judicial proceedings pending at the time of the exchange of ratifications of this treaty, in the territories over which Spain relinquishes or cedes her sovereignty shall be determined according to certain laws, which are given.

Article XIII. This provides that rights of property secured by copyrights and patents, etc., shall be respected.

Article XIV. This provides that Spain will have power to establish consular offices in ports and places of the territories.

Article XV. The government of each country will, for the term of ten years, accord to the merchant vessels of the other country the same treatment in respect of all port charges, including entrance and clearance dues, wharf dues and tonnage duties, as it accords to its own merchant vessels not engaged in the coastwise trade.

Article XVI. This article may at any time be terminated on six months' notice given by either government to the other.

Article XVII. It is understood that any obligations assumed in this treaty by the United States with respect to Cuba are limited to the time of its occupancy thereof, but it will, upon the termination of its occupancy, require any government established in the island to assume the same obligations.

Article XVIII. This provides that the present treaty shall be ratified by the president of the United States, by and with the advice and consent of the senate thereof, and by her majesty, the queen regent of Spain; and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Washington within six months from the date hereof, or earlier if possible.

DIRECT WITH REBELS.

Rios Reported to Be Negotiating For Prisoners and Aguinaldo Gone to Head Philippines at Iloilo.

MADRID, Jan. 6.—The following official dispatch was received from Manila: "The insurgents refuse to liberate the prisoners on the demand of the Americans, claiming that this might be construed as an act of submission to the United States."

Paris, Jan. 6.—Official telegram received by the Filipino junta here dated Manila, Jan. 4, said that Aguinaldo had gone to Iloilo, at the request of the insurgents there, to place himself at their head, with the view of their possible fighting with the Americans.

Chicago, Jan. 6.—Six highwaymen who were endeavoring to make their escape after having held up the dry-goods store of H. C. T. Boardman, at 227 Twenty-first place, engaged in a shooting affray with policemen Edward Wallner and John McCauley and both officers were wounded, Wallner dying some hours later in the hospital.
