A GLINTING RAY COMES

A FIERCE FIGHT REPORTED.

Shanghai, July 9.—(Delayed.)—It is reported that Prince Tuan has ordered four generals, Tung Fu Nang, Sung Chiang, Nah and Nieh, to oppose the advance of any column sent from Tien Tsin to Peking.
