### SHIP WILL BE HELD

Newport News, Feb. 23.—After a day of wild rumors varying from the assassination of the American consul at Santiago to the demand for more troops in the Philippines, Newport News learned this evening, that the large army transport Sumner, almost loaded with supplies for the army of pacification in Cuba, and scheduled to sail tomorrow, will be unloaded at once and the ship will be held here for special mission. Orders to this effect were received today by telegraph from Washington by Major G. S. Bingharn, depot quartermaster, but he would not discuss the details. He was advised that his orders for dispatching the transport would arrive by mail tomorrow.

### ENGINEER KILLED AND FIREMAN FATALLY HURT

Pittsburg, Pa., Feb. 23.—Passenger train No. 49 westbound on the Baltimore & Ohio railroad, jumped the track this evening shortly after 6 o'clock, just before she reached Connelville. Wiley Irwin, the engineer, of Pittsburg, was instantly killed, the fireman is said to have been fatally injured, and six passengers were slightly injured.
