From the Pittsburg-Indian Hostilities.

The Central Overland Pike's Express arrived this evening with advices to the 24th and Denver City dates to the 26th. A meeting of citizens was held last evening for the purpose of taking precautionary measures for defense in case they were attacked by Indians.

There are now large numbers of Kiawas, Apaches, Comanches, Sioux, Cheyennes and Arapahoes camped within a few miles of the city, and some preparations have been committed on ranches in the vicinity, but nothing serious, no fears are entertained of serious trouble by old settlers.

The Pony Express with the dispatches and mail missing from the Pony Express, which arrived Tuesday evening last, arrived here at 3:20 p. m. of the 6th. The explanation is given as follows: The Pony Express was delayed at the station at Carson, where some thirty miles north of the mouth of Carson Valley, and also that various companies had organized at Virginia City Gold Hill and other settlements in Washoe Mines and gone in pursuit of the Indians.
