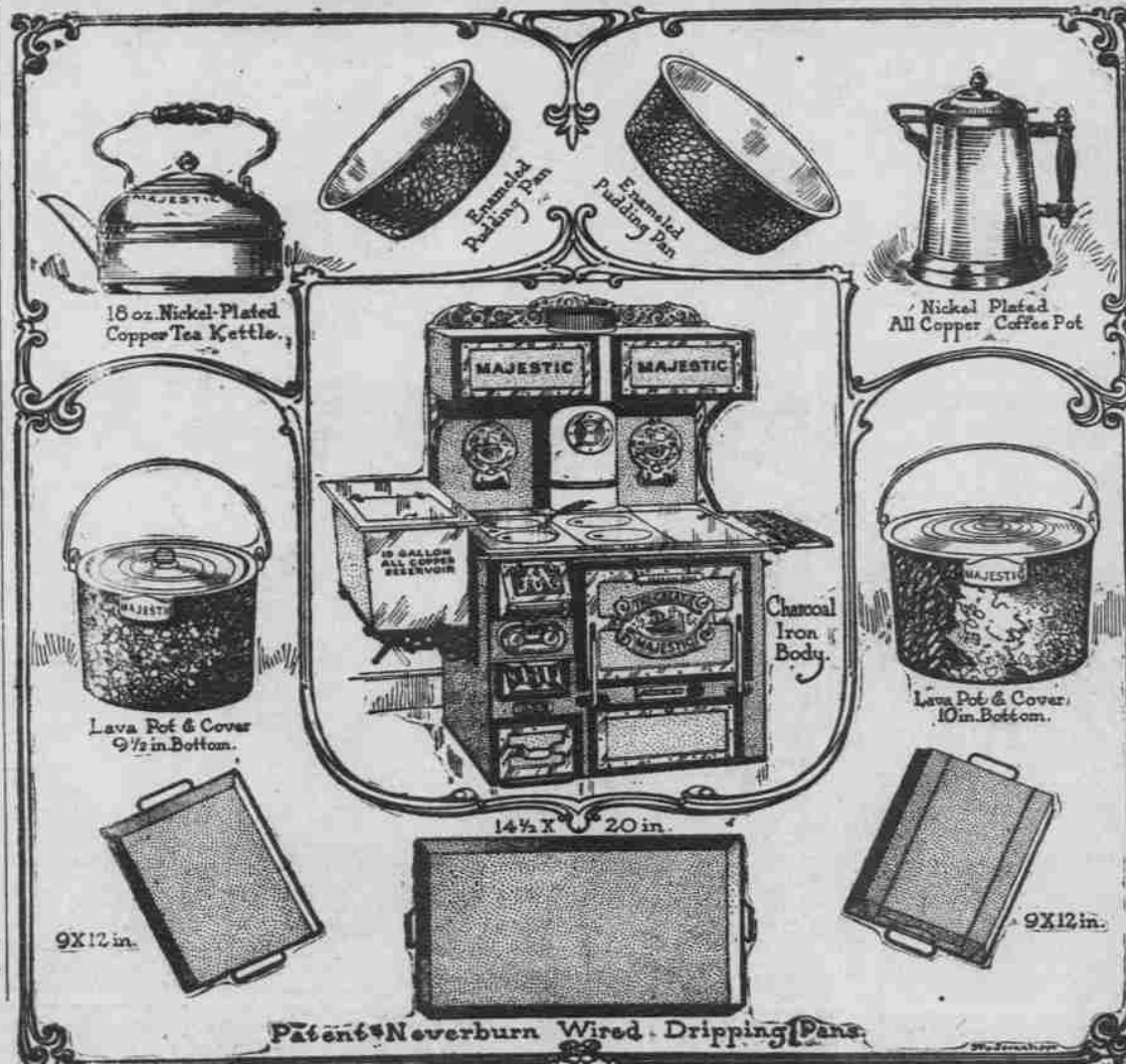

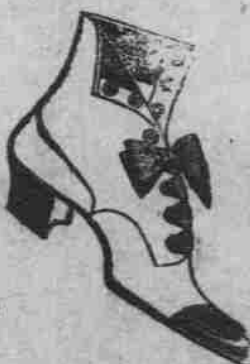

THOUGHTS ON BUSINESS

A TASK FOR REFORMERS
