### A ST. LOUIS CONNECTION.

A railroad enterprise with a probable termination at Dodge City, is the latest venture in railroad connection. The St. Louis Republican says of the proposed road:

The St. Louis, Kansas & Wichita Railroad is the name of a new road, 144 miles in length, about to be constructed and which, when completed, will form an important connection with St. Louis. The new road will extend from Oswego, in Labette county, Kansas, to Wichita, on the Arkansas river. It will form the continuation of the Missouri & Western Road, the latter starting from Pierce City, on the line of the St. Louis & San Francisco Railroad, and known as the Kansas Branch.

The distance from Pierce City to Oswego is 83 miles, which is already built, and from Oswego to Wichita, 144 miles, which will make the whole length of completed road 227 miles. The St. Louis & San Francisco Railroad Company have bought the charter, right of way of the new route and the portion of the Carthage road, and the counties have subscribed \$553,000 to aid in building it. The entire cost of the road and equipment will be \$3,000,000.

Mr. Blicksederfer, the chief engineer, and a corps of engineers, have about completed the preliminary survey of the route from Oswego, and the contract for building the entire line will be closed within ten days. The counties through which it passes are Labette, Montgomery, Wilson, Greenwood, Butler and Sedgwick. Oswego, the starting point, is 23 miles west of the Missouri line. The route passes about 18 miles south of Parsons and taps a rich, fertile country, nineteen-twentieths of which is beautiful prairie, well watered, with a deep alluvial soil, adapted to agriculture and producing great yields of wheat, and underlaid by an abundance of coal. The wheat is already headed out. This section will be entirely a feeder to St. Louis, cutting off the entire southeast corner of Kansas, and will strongly compete for the business with the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe; the Missouri, Kansas & Texas; the Lawrence, Leavenworth & Galveston, and the Missouri River, Fort Scott & Gulf, all Chicago roads, and will draw every pound of freight this way.

### THE DRIVE OF 1879.

The Indicator presents this week another full budget of information in reference to the drive of cattle and ponies from Texas to Kansas and the Territories.

Our report from Fort Griffin, Texas, is as usual full and complete, giving even the brands, which the readers of the Indicator could not have failed to notice in the previous reports. In the absence of a special report from Fort Worth, Texas, this week, we have used the figures as given in the Democrat, of that place, and which we presume are correct.

From the reports given it will appear that there have arrived at Fort Worth and Fort Griffin, Texas, up to the date of these reports, 117,490 head of cattle, of which number 43,610 had arrived at Fort Griffin and 73,882 at Fort Worth. Of the arrivals at Fort Griffin, 33,760 were bound north, while of those at Fort Worth the number which will remain in northern Texas is not given, but it is fair to say that they will number in the neighborhood of 5,000.

There are quite a number of ponies which are being driven up this year, the arrivals at Red Fork Ranch, Indian Territory, up to May 13 being 4,080.—[Commercial Indicator.]

### Arkansas River Navigation.

The steamer Cherokee or New Suck, has arrived at Fort Smith, from Arkansas City, Kansas, with a full cargo of wheat, and reports the river above low water mark, but navigable by small boats. Twenty thousand bushels of wheat will come down from Arkansas City in the June rig

### ATTACKING KANSAS CITY.

The Ford county, Kas. Globe, published at Dodge City, Kas., last week contained an article attacking the management of the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe railroad in a savage manner, charging that discrimination in rates were made in favor of Kansas City, and that nothing has been done toward securing an outlet beyond its Missouri river termini for stock men patronizing its line, and that the way things are now managed western stock men cannot reach the eastern markets without paying a toll for passing through Kansas City.

The Los Animas, Col., Leader notices approvingly the tirade of the Dodge City paper, and says that "We have long believed that the same organized effort should be made to get through rates, which would enable our stock men who ship the better grades to sell directly in Chicago. The rapid improvement in the quality of Colorado beef cattle renders this step more and more imperative.

The Indicator is pleased that the discussion has been brought out, for now it is enabled to know who the friends of Kansas City are. And we will here venture the assertion that the largest stock raisers in the neighborhood of the place where the papers from which we have quoted are published, do not endorse them in their attacks on the Kansas City live stock market.

Our live stock market stands upon its merits as the best market for Kansas and Colorado stock raisers, and if the editors of the Dodge City Globe and Los Animas Leader will consult with some one of their old and experienced live stock shippers, they will find out that invariably when shipments were made to Chicago instead of Kansas City, money was lost.

But at any rate our live stock commission merchants can remember these gentlemen, who are endeavoring to drive trade away from our city.
