The state senate this afternoon, by a vote of 27 to 22, adopted the Gatch bill, which allows county option, each community being given the right to settle the liquor question for itself by elections to take place not oftener than every five years.

The matter can be brought up only on the petition of one-fifth of the legal voters. Three republican senators this afternoon sided with a number of democrats in the passage of the bill.


