## LIBRARY AND SCHOOLS

Shall the Board of Education of Dodge City Issue Bonds.

It is apparent to every one who has given the subject any consideration that something must be done to provide more room for our over-crowded schools. We must have at least one more room this year than we had last year. The only feasible plan seems to be to build four rooms on the south side of the Second ward building and that building was planned and erected with that end in view and by building there we save the expense of halls and stairways. We can build four rooms there about as cheap as we could build a separate building of two rooms; we can then sell the little frame building as we will then be able to accommodate all the children for a number of years. Our idea is to make the addition the long way east and west which we think will add very much to the appearance of the present building (which is a matter that should be considered) but will make the whole building a very solid and substantial structure.

Now a word as to the cost: The district now has outstanding \$18,000.00 6 per cent bonds making a total interest charge of \$1080.00. The Board of Education has arranged with the School Fund Commissioners to refund these bonds and issue new bonds at 4 1/2 per cent running twenty years, thus saving each year on what we have been paying, \$15 on each bond or \$270 on the eighteen bonds. The \$6000.00 which we ask permission to issue will be 4 1/2 per cent bonds and the annual interest charge will be just \$270. so that so far as the interest charge is concerned the levy for interest this year will not be any more than it was last year which was 3 mills and in fact it will not be quite so much because the taxable valuation of the district will be a little more this year than it was last year. The valuation last year was \$181,043 and counting that it will not be any larger this year. Let us see what we will have to pay as taxes for school bond interest this year and see if we can afford to vote the additional \$6000.00.

For example we will take John Doe who owns \$3000.00 worth of property and he gives it to the assessor for taxation at a valuation of \$1000.00 (and the chances are that he would not give it in for more than \$500) and the portion he would have to pay for interest on school bonds would be just \$2.50 or 25 cents on each \$100

of valuation returned by him and this amount would include the total amount to be paid by him on the total bonded indebtedness of \$24,500.00. The great majority of tax payers, after deducting the \$200 exemption, would not have to pay to exceed 50c while those who do not own over \$200 worth of property, and who have a family to support, will not have to pay a single penny.

I have called attention to the above facts because the Board of Education needs and wants the hearty co-operation of all our citizens to the end that we may build up our schools so that each grade will be second to none in a city of the second class in this state, and we feel that you realize as we do, that this condition does not exist at this time.

I call attention to the above facts for another reason and that is that some persons are claiming that we can not afford to accept a donation of a nice \$7500.00 library building and agree to make a levy sufficient to raise \$750 per year to maintain the library, because we must provide additional school rooms, and that will be all the additional burden of taxation we can stand this year. I think I have shown that there will be no additional school tax this year but rather it will be a little less than last year. The said bonds when refunded and also the \$6000 new bonds will run for twenty years so there will be no need of making a levy for a sinking fund for ten years and even then one will not need to make the rate very burdensome because our bonds are all held by the state and all of them which have not been paid when they are due can be refunded.

Now to raise the \$750 required to procure the library will cost each tax payer about 2 1/2 cents on each \$100 of the valuation returned by him to the assessor (provided his \$200 exemption does not amount to as much or more than the total valuation returned by him) and if his taxable valuation amounts to \$1000 his library tax would be \$2.25. I understand that one or two men who own less than \$3000 worth of property and who will return to the assessor for taxation not to exceed \$1000 have already spent more than time enough in arguing against the library proposition to have earned at the rate of \$1.00 per day enough to have paid their library tax for several years. There are only a few men in Dodge City who own enough property to make their library tax a matter of much importance, and so far as I have heard most of these men are in favor of the library.
