### WAS A JOINT WORM.

Where Wheat has been Injured Straw Should be Burned.

A few weeks ago there was some complaint in parts of Ford county that wheat was being damaged, and there seemed to be very little idea as to what was doing the damage.

Mr. L. K. VanHorne, the grain dealer at Ford, sent a sample of damaged wheat to the State Experimental Station at Manhattan and Prof. Geo. A. Dean, Professor of Entomology, says it is the joint-worm that has effected the wheat in this section. A copy of his letter follows:

Mr. L. K. VanHorne, Ford, Kansas,

Dear Sir: In reply to your favor of the 7th inst. which has been referred to this department, will say, that on examining the straw right at the joint you will find a very small worm which is called the joint-worm. It causes a hard woody growth which causes the head to blast or turn white. There is nothing that can be done to prevent its work on this crop. As the insects live in the straw, burning the straw will do much in preventing the following year.

### OLD TIME PLAINSMAN

Arrested for Murder of a County Commissioner at Syracuse.

A. M. Huffman, ex-sheriff of Hamilton county was arrested on Monday on the charge of killing County Commissioner Henry Thacker at Syracuse.

On Sunday night someone who was hidden in bushes near Thacker's home, shot Thacker. The weapon used was a shot gun. He died a short time later but before dying he stated that he had been shot by Huffman.

Huffman is an old time plainsman. For fourteen years he was in the regular army, and he was in this country through much of the Indian troubles. He was through here in an early day with Custer and was with Lawton when Geronimo was captured.

Huffman denies killing Thacker and it seems that public sentiment at Syracuse is with Huffman. The two men have been strong friends, at least until recently. There has been a report heard here, that Huffman's wife had applied for a divorce and that Thacker is thought to be responsible for Huffman's domestic troubles.

### NO TRIAL YET.

Swanzy Brothers' Arrest Looks Still More Like Spite Work.

The Swanzy brothers and Austin Bailey went to LaCrosse the first of the week to appear for preliminary trial, on charge of arson. They found the county attorney was not ready to hear the case and that he insisted on continuing it another week.

It appears that there is no evidence whatever on which to found a suspicion against the Swanzy and Bailey. When the officers came here after them they swooped down with a gun play and used the hand cuffs. Since that time there has been nothing to show that there is anything against the defendants.

### PLENTY OF WHEAT.

Ford County is Harvesting an Immense Crop Again This Year.

Harvest opened up this week but was delayed in some parts of the county by quite a heavy shower of rain. The rainfall however was not accompanied by wind or hail and did no damage.

The general impression at the beginning of harvest is that Ford county will have more wheat this year than she has ever had before.

Two weeks ago there was quite a scare over the condition of some fields, and every day reports came in that the wheat crop would be seriously damaged. During the past week reports have become more and more favorable. Taking the county all over the wheat is what may be called a good crop. Many samples brought in show a very good quality too.

There is a large acreage in the county, enough to put Ford county deeper in the wheat belt than she was two years ago.

In some parts of the county the heads were started this week.

### BAD WHISKY HUNT

Soldiers' Home Management Presumed to be on Watch for Boozie Peddlers.

Since the trouble at the Soldiers' home in which Truax shot and killed two other old soldiers as the out growth of associating with bad whisky it is understood that the management of the home has been carefully considering the whisky question. There is a pretty strict law against selling, or even giving whisky to an old soldier and any one who supplies members of the home with liquor is certainly looking for trouble and will have a short hunt in finding it.

Commandant Thomas stated on the day following the trouble at the home that the matter would be thoroughly investigated and it is understood that the investigation has been on ever since.

Schloker. When arrested he did not deny taking the horse but excused the action on the ground that the ranch people had turned their stock in on his crops, and the horse taken was not more than pay for the damage done.

Keller claims to belong to a prominent eastern family, and says that he has a brother who is well known in the government service. When asked if he could not get help in his present trouble from his family, Keller said that the family had discarded him several years ago because of his religion. He claims to have been a follower of Dowie and a former citizen of Zion, before he joined the backsliders.

Deputy Sheriff A. B. Cord arrived here yesterday evening from Guymon and has returned, taking Keller with him.
