The remains were brought here on No. 29 Sunday, and should have been here at about 9:35 a. m., but as something went wrong on the road east, the train did not arrive here until about 4:35 p. m. The funeral was held at the M. E. church at five p. m. Sunday, Rev. G. E. Tuttle conducting the services. She was buried in the Bucklin cemetery. Mrs. McNutt was a widow 44 years of age. She came from Ohio to Bucklin about nine years ago and has lived here since then until she went to the hospital at Hutchinson for treatment a few weeks ago. She leaves a son, Glenn McNutt a young man about 20 years old, who lives here and was with his mother when she died, and one brother, Mr. G. T. Trayer of this place; but at present he and his family are at Long Beach, Cal. funeral.

## A SIX YEAR RECORD OF WHEAT RAISING

On a Ford County Upland Farm

Will wheat raising pay on upland farms in Ford county?

Experience has answered the above question. The answer is that it will pay, and that wheat farming is a safe proposition one year with another. A few years may make the wheat farmer in Ford county wealthy. In any case it will pay well. The GLOBE-REPUBLICAN recently gave Mr. Staith's record for a long term of years. That record shows that wheat raising pays well.

Another record for a shorter term of years has been received by this office from Mr. Staith, and will be found below. Please notice it carefully.

The record of Mr. Staith shows that his average yield per acre for the past 6 years is 12 bushels.

It shows that after deducting interest on his investment, pay for all work done and taking out for all expenses incurred, that he has \$117.42 clear profit.

Remember that this record is only on an average of 88 acres of ground. That it is but a small part of his farming operations, and that he has had the greater part of these six years to devote to other things.

If he had come out barely even he would have been well paid for his work and for his investment, and the raise in price of the land during the six years would have put him ahead of the game \$1500. But he had a clear gain on the crop of \$197.42 and consequently is \$2697.42 ahead on this piece of ground.

Out of an investment of \$500, besides a reasonable annual interest, and the opportunity for employment a good wage, he has in six years \$2697.42

The land is Ford county upland, such as is now selling, unimproved, for \$8 and \$10 per acre.

I have kept a record for the past six years on wheat grown on the south east quarter of 7-27-25, with the following result.
