UNPRECEDENTED ACTIVITY IN GRANT COUNTY MINING INDUSTRY

Fred A. Bush, editor and manager of the Silver City Enterprise, is in the city from the flourishing Grant county...

"The Colorado Fuel & Iron company is putting all the men it can get to work on its iron properties at Pierra. The Phelps Dodge people are working twenty men on the old Hanover mine and making regular shipments of ore."

"At Santa Rita. The Santa Rita Copper company, at Santa Rita, is running its mill night and day and shipping between eight and twenty cars of concentrates a month."

"C. J. Longhren, manager of the Comanche Copper company in the Comanche district, which owns the big smelter at Silver City, went to El Paso last week to hurry up shipments of silicas, fish plaques, etc., for the narrow gauge railway to Pinos Altos."

"In the Mogollons. It is interesting that Messrs. Cooney and Weatherly have made a deal whereby they acquire some of the best properties in the Mogollon district. Their claims include the famous Little Fannie mine. They have plenty of Pennsylvania money back of them and are going to do things."
