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JAP DEMANDS ON CHINA MODIFIED ONLY SLIGHTLY FROM ORIGINAL

Five articles bearing on the Japanese demand upon China were included as an appendix to the Japanese note to the Chinese minister, and Koo Hio-ki, the Japanese minister, at the conference which was held at the Japanese legation yesterday. The Japanese minister recently suffered slight injuries by a fall from his horse and condition did not permit him to go to the Chinese foreign office and for this reason the meeting was transferred to the legation.

Concessions by China

All the articles concern Manchuria. China agreed to the following stipulations: First, the Japanese government's consent shall be obtained before a loan is made with a third power involving the pledging of local taxes in south Manchuria.

Japan Modifies Demands

The Japanese government has definitely withdrawn what is known as "article 2" of the fifth group, namely, the demand for a joint police administration of important cities through-out China and also has indicated its willingness, it is announced, to withdraw one or two other articles from this so-called general group.

Small Returns From Coal
