PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 7.—Thousands of baseball fans lined the sidewalks for hours today to get their tickets for the opening game of the world's series between the Phillies and the Red Sox.

Neither weather man nor personal observation answered the question asked in the minds of the fans for a steady drizzle began early in the afternoon.
