SHIP WRECKED AND 25 LIVES ARE LOST

By Morning Journal Special Leader Wire Tacoma, Wash., Nov. 25.—Special address to the Ledger tonight from Victoria, B. C., state that the Chilean tall rigged four-masted iron ship Carmelpa has been lost with all hands, numbering about twenty-five.

The Carmelpa, the dispatch said, was driven ashore before a terrific southwest gale on the west coast of Vancouver island and was pounded to pieces after several hours of battling on the rocks.

At great risk, the Canadian Pacific railway steamer Princess Maguinn, Captain Gilliam, attempted to go to the rescue of the crew clinging to the wrecked craft, but she was unable to approach and the women were washed off and drowned.

ECONOMY PLANS BEING PRESSED BY THE ENGLISH

Much Can Be Saved in Importation of Unnecessary Articles, Which Can Be Diverted to War Purposes.

(Associated Press Correspondence.) London, Nov. 25.—The campaign of economy in living as a vital necessity for financing the war which is costing Great Britain nearly \$25,000,000 a day continues to be pressed.

That government expenses must be decreased and the gap between exports and imports narrowed is agreed upon by all. Various and often conflicting remedies are proposed.

Lord Devonport, who has had long experience as a successful business man, told the house of lords the importation of non-essential things through the port of London alone had reached \$125,000,000 a year.

Several statesmen have proclaimed the necessity of keeping up Great Britain's general manufacturing as the best method to try to balance the foreign trade account.

The German principle is to rope in every man who can fight," he says, "and to subordinate the requirements of trade to those of victory, certain that if victory can be achieved everything else will come with it."

Thirty New Divisions Needed. He considers that thirty new divisions should be added to the army by next August and involves what it would profit to say that export trade was flourishing but that the "armies were defeated."

What is the use of victory in the field if the army which wins it cannot be kept in being, for lack of money to maintain it? The paper inquires, "of what avail is our naval supremacy if we have no longer the funds for the credit to buy the food of which the very masses live?"

ARTESIA MAN IS SERIOUSLY HURT WHILE HUNTING

Accidental Discharge of Gun Likely to Cost Simpson Albright His Arm in Spite of Best Medical Attention.

(SPECIAL DISPATCH TO MORNING JOURNAL.) Artesia, N. M., Nov. 25.—While hunting about two and one-half miles out of town this morning Simpson Albright, who runs the sprinkling system in this city, was accidentally shot in the left elbow and was seriously wounded, that tonight physicians are of the opinion that it will be necessary to amputate his left arm.

He was accompanied on his hunting trip by a young boy, Arthur Albright, and had crossed a fence ahead of the boy. Young Albright followed him through the fence and when Albright was about eight feet from him the boy's gun was accidentally discharged, the full force of the shot striking Albright in the left elbow.

He was brought to town at once and given medical treatment but it is doubtful if the arm can be saved.
