CONGRESS SHOULD WAKE UP.

The dilly-dallying in congress over preparedness is disgusting, as the inadequacy of the preparedness measures are disgusting to the people of the nation generally.

If Germany should win in this war, decisively, she would be overlord of the world. There would be no danger of an invasion of the United States, because, in our state of unpreparedness, we would be at her mercy and would pay such indemnities as she might demand.

Furthermore, we would not be allowed to prepare to defend ourselves. Germany would tell us how many warships we might have and how much of an army we could maintain.

Beyond doubt, a German victory would be followed by a Teutonic-Japanese alliance. Japan's ambitions are just as inordinate as the Kaiser's were.

But let us suppose that Germany should not be victorious. The truth is that England's new alliances diminish Japan's place in England's affections.

Unless Germany comes out of this war utterly broken and incapable of aggression—which may occur, but is not likely—she, like Japan, will be casting about for a new friend.

There are important conditions to be fulfilled before such a league can be negotiated. But its possibility is sufficiently forehad-owed to command our earnest consideration.

THE FIGHT ON WILSON.

The German newspapers—meaning, of course, the newspapers published in Germany—are indulging in quite as much abuse of President Wilson, just now, as may be found in the Kaiser's newspapers published in the United States.

The Berlin editors have an idea, not entirely without justification, that the president's efforts to protect the neutral rights of this nation may be nullified by the national legislature.

Never before has a congress of the United States fallen so low in the estimation of a foreign power. Never before has the general tone of the press of any foreign nation indicated the belief that the representatives of the American people could be depended upon to side with the monarch of that nation against the president of the United States.

We believe that the German editors are mistaken. While everybody knows there are many trimmers in congress—men of little ability and less principle—we do not believe that a majority of the men elected to the house and the senate would fail to support the rights of this nation against the aggressions of any foreign nation.

There is a majority in congress composed of men of principle and patriotism, who, even if they haven't great ability, can be depended upon not to betray the nation.

NOW UP TO CARRANZA.

The American army in Mexico is being withdrawn toward the border, concentrating for the purpose of being able to protect itself against any hostile attack by the Carranza troops.

But Washington has decided that there shall be no immediate withdrawal. Before Pershing returns north of the border, there is to be a clear understanding with Carranza as to the attitude he will assume toward the bandits and other disorderly elements in Mexico.

From the time of the Santa Ysabel massacre to the present, the de facto government has done nothing toward stamping out lawlessness. Villa was allowed to raid much as he wished, to rob where he liked, and kill whomsoever he chose.

Such condition never can be allowed again. It shouldn't have been permitted before. Carranza is to be told, we imagine, that he must show more energy in the preservation of order, or the American soldiers never will be withdrawn from Mexico.

Holland's neutrality is no easy job just now. A high official of the government says Holland is afraid that if one of the belligerents should violate her neutrality the other side would insist upon coming to help her.

Commencement Exercises Late in May to Be Elaborate; Fourteen Members of Class of 1916 to Graduate.

M., April 24.—Although the final exercises of the New Mexico Military Institute are a month in the future, active preparations are going forward for the events of commencement week, and the prospects are that the occasion will be one of the most notable in the history of the institution.

Had it not been for the fact that United States troops were sent across the border into Mexico in pursuit of Francisco Villa and his bandits, the commencement address this year would have been delivered by General John J. Pershing, as all plans had been perfected to that end.

Several of this year's graduates have made splendid impressions upon the United States army officers who have inspected the battalion and have been recommended for lieutenantcies in the regular army. It is probable that they will receive commissions in the proposed addition to the regular service now being arranged in accordance with the preparedness plans of congress.

The athletic activities of the Institute this year have been unusually successful, an especially strong baseball team being turned out this spring which added greatly to the athletic prestige of the school.

The swimming tank at the Institute is finding great favor with the cadets these warm spring afternoons, and some expert swimmers are to be found in the ranks of the battalion.
