SAN MIGUEL IS LAST COUNTY TO MAKE PROVISION FOR STATE FAIR

Appropriation Made by County Commissioners Is Just Fifty per Cent More Than That of Last Year.

LAS VEGAS ASSURED OF PROSPEROUS FUTURE

Population Likely to Double in Four Years; Mora, Grant and Sierra Now Also in Limelight.

The commissioners of San Miguel county, following the rule of all counties so far visited by President Southard in the interest of the New Mexico state fair board, 'came across' without the slightest hesitation, with an appropriation of \$750—just 50 per cent more than last year—for the county exhibit at the state fair.

Mora county took similar action on the previous day. Thus, wherever Mr. Southard goes, there is the finest possible spirit of co-operation, and people everywhere look over the hostility and the opposition shown when approached by Mr. Southard's predecessor, Mr. R. E. Putney, last year, in his campaign for the first state fair ever held in New Mexico.

San Miguel and Sierra. But while prosperity has touched every section of New Mexico, and people are feeling good everywhere, Las Vegas has a special reason for rejoicing. As with Sierra county, this is an epochal year in San Miguel's history.

The Campfield project is now assured. What has been dreamed of for many years, is to be realized within the next twelve months. The money has been paid to clear up all indebtedness, and the money for the bank for the completion of the dam and the construction of the ditches, and men are now at work and tents are being pitched for more laborers, on the construction of an irrigation system that will immediately reclaim 12,000 acres of the most productive land in the world, and the farthest acre is not more than five miles from the Las Vegas depot and the nearest farms will be only a few hundred yards from the heart of the city.

Laas Vegas shows that the days of delay and uncertainty have passed. The most pessimistic citizen is now an optimist. There is the thrill of a new life. Men are talking and planning for a bigger and more prosperous city, and they are going to have their wish soon. There is no room yet—but the spirit which always precedes a boom is there. It is in every store, on every street corner, in the hotel lobbies. It is walking every street and talking all the time.

Mora's Future Sure. But that is not all that is coming to Las Vegas soon. Some day, in the not very distant future, there will be an electrical road from Las Vegas to Mora, the picturesque and wealthy little city only thirty miles away.

One has only to travel over the state to know that it is taking on new life, that new enterprises are soon to be undertaken with every assurance that they will pay, that New Mexico is just at the beginning of its prosperity. Grant county is already moving forward so fast that its people are unable to digest the prosperity.

(Associated Press Correspondence.) Piraeus, Greece, May 15.—The port of Piraeus possesses today a vastly different aspect from that of a year and a half ago. The conspicuous offices of the Hamburg-America, Norddeutscher Lloyd and Austrian Lloyd lines, deserted and deserted where once so busy, mark the passing of a considerable factor in the marine activity of the port of Athens.
