BUTTE, Sept. 17.—The common council will meet to-morrow evening and one of the matters to be brought up for discussion may have an important bearing on the site for a new city hall and the time when it will be built.

Mayor Kenyon was asked by a STANDARD reporter yesterday whether, in his opinion, the city would accept the offer of \$10,000 for the new city hall.

"I do not think the offer will be accepted. The city is obtaining a very good interest on its money from rentals of the building now on the site, the \$10,000 invested is not remaining idle by any means.
