The court, who wishes to sustain counsel's motion and discharged the prisoner. Immediately upon the woman's discharge she was re-arrested upon a charge of grand larceny for stealing the same money as alleged in the two former complaints. The charge of grand larceny was then taken up by the court. Counsel for defense at once entered plea of former acquittal. This ground was thoroughly canvassed and the court decided that the defendant could be tried for grand larceny after having been acquitted on the two former charges.

Counsel then entered plea of not guilty, and elected to be tried at the district court. The prisoner was accordingly bound over to appear at the next session of the district court. The enactment of this little legal farce amused the numerous spectators in the court room, who were unable to understand how the same person could be arrested upon the same charge three times within half an hour.
